A Word From The President

Our Board of Directors recently reviewed our 2015 Mid-Year (January – June) year to date Operating financials and I am happy to report the following:

- Total Operating income year to date is above budget by about \$27,000 and \$59,000 above 2014
- Total Operating expenses are below budget by about \$11,000
- Our total year to date Operating surplus to budget is about \$38,000
- Food and Beverage totals, which include grill, bar and dining, are slightly off budget by \$2,000. Our food and beverage operations are budgeted to break even and we should be able to accomplish this by year end.

So, you can see that Mark Updike and our staff our doing a great job with the operations of our club. I ask that all members continue to be active in our club and provide feedback/suggestions to me and the Board where we can improve. We have much to be proud of and our Board will continue to plan for the long term success of High Meadows.

With regard to Membership, please continue to think about people and groups we can expose to High Meadows. We know that once people experience the wonderful golf course, our excellent dining experience, our friendly membership and the cooler mountain weather, our club will sell itself! We are in peak season for the next several months so, we will continue to build upon the new member success we had in 2014.

Our near term Capital needs for 2016 will include some golf course equipment and we will have more information with some recommendations from the Board very soon.

Tip of The Month: Playing from Rough

Biggest key for getting out of rough is hitting the ball first. Hitting the ball first will maximize the distance out of the shot. Begin by moving the ball back in your stance as well as choking down slightly. This will promote a descending blow, as well as more control of the club, promoting ball first contact. Also I would recommend always to use more loft trying to get the ball back in play and taking your medicine. This will give you a larger margin for error and help you shrink your odds of making a higher score than necessary.

Course News:

- A. Cart Policies: The maintenance staff continues to work hard to keep the course in excellent shape and we need to do our part to assist them! Please keep carts away from greens and tees and also try to scatter as often as possible to keep from burning tracks into the grass.
- B. **Noise:** Please do not use radios or music playing electronics while on the course.
- C. **Driving Range:** Closes each Monday at 4:30pm for clean pick. (Allowing for maintenance to mow)

Dress code questions have been posed so we are including our policy as a reminder:

GENERAL DRESS CODE POLICY

Traditional Dining Rooms (Dogwood & Redbud)

Appropriate country club attire is expected at all times in the Traditional Dining Rooms with the exception of "Casual Fridays, Wednesdays and Relaxed Sundays", and other club sponsored golf and social events.

- Men must wear collared shirts, turtlenecks, or mock turtlenecks.
- No shorts of any kind, hats / visors, or golf shoes, except when dining immediately follows a club sponsored golf or social event.
- No "beach-like" rubber flip-flops at any time.
- No denim of any kind or color; pants, shirts, or jackets allowed on Saturdays in the main dining area.
- Jackets for the gentlemen are requested, ties are not required in the main dining area on Saturday evenings.

Casual attire is appropriate at all times. However, cutoffs or torn and tattered clothing are not permitted. Swimsuits must have top and bottom cover-ups.

Casual Fridays & Wednesday's & "Relaxed Sunday's"

- Appropriate denim, fitting properly and not torn or tattered, can be worn.
- Bermuda style shorts are permitted of appropriate length; no cut-offs.
- No "beach-like" rubber flip-flops should be worn.
- No sweat pants, t-shirts, or sweatshirts can be worn.
- No hats / visors or golf shoes...except when dining immediately follows a club sponsored golf or social event.

The dress code parameters apply to both adults and juniors. Out of courtesy for other members and guests, cell phones should be set to silent or vibrate while on the clubhouse grounds.
