#### **Pros Corner**

We are now in the peak season and the golf course is in excellent condition! We have had some great events this year and some more exciting tournaments approaching. Ladies Member-Guest, Ryder Cup, Member-Guest and our Club Championships are fast approaching and hope you mark your calendars to join us! Help support your club by being an active member. Please let the golf shop know if we can assist with your experience at the club in anyway!

#### TIP OF THE MONTH! SHORT GAME

If you were to watch a professional golfer during a practice session, it would look much different than that of most amateurs. They spend 75% of their time practicing shots 120 yards or less! Why? Because in an average round 65% of their shots are taken within that yardage range and they understand that tournaments are won and lost with the short game. Hint: Stop pounding drivers on the range and focus on your short game, it will yield results.

Just get the ball on the green (preferably in the middle). Don't worry about the position of the pin. The probability of an amateur two-putting is much, much higher than getting up and down from off the green. More so, the likelihood of one-putting is even higher than chipping in! This strategy is a shot to the ego, but it will turn three or four bogeys into pars, or double bogeys into bogeys. Now that is some savings!
