Title: Summer Decline and Leaf Spot Diseases of Warm Season Turfgrass

Summer decline and leaf spot diseases are two of the most troubling issues on warm season turfgrass. Summer decline can be a combination of Pythium, algae, take all root rot, and other pathogens caused by high temperatures and plant stress. Leaf spot diseases are typically seen in transition periods where warm season turf is going in or coming out of dormancy. Reducing plant stress is a key part of managing these diseases. This seminar will cover the biology of these diseases, how plants respond to them, and how to control them with cultural and chemical means, including how to use plant health promoting products.
