Join us Monday May 1st for a Scramble Fund Raiser for the First Tee. The First Tee is a youth development organization introducing the



# Turf Talk By: TJ West, Superintendant

Many of you know that Brent Courtney, the Assistant Superintendent, had a medical episode on March 14<sup>th</sup> resulting in an accident on number 7. As I write this newsletter. Brent is at home continuing to recover from his injuries and is being evaluated by his doctors to find the cause of the issue. Thank you to all that have stopped maintenance staff members to ask about and wish him well! With the injury to Brent, talking it over with both Andrea and Escalante corporate staff, and much thought, I decided that making the trip to the Shell Houston Open was not in my best interest or the best interest of Grand Haven. My decision was surprisingly easy given my love of the golf course and my profession! I appreciate the opportunity given to me by Escalante and I hope to possibly make a future trip!

March gave us our coldest temperatures of the Winter. The 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> both saw lows around 36 degrees. Those two days accounted for 2/3rds of our frost days this winter. Not too bad! The cold temperatures turned some turf off color (mostly the rough), however a quick recovery is expected! The

dry/windy weather pattern has continued and according to some forecasts...we will be dry for a while! In March we only received 1.3 inches of rainfall. Hopefully the Meteorologists are wrong and we start seeing some precipitation! With the wind and lack of rain, keeping the turf moist has been and will continue to be an issue. We are working hard to combat this and so far...we are ahead of the curve!

In April we will start becoming more aggressive with our cultural practices. On April 3<sup>rd</sup> we will perform a solid tine aerification the greens. No material will be pulled! The purpose is to relieve compaction and let air into the root zone. The common name for this practice is "venting" greens. The hole will be smaller than a pencil will be rolled immediately after. There should be no disruption of play. On April 17th the first heavy verticut, for thatch and grain control, will be done to the greens followed by a light sand application. This will then be done on a biweekly basis until the fall. I had scheduled the verticut for mid -March, but the late cold snap caused us to postpone. We will also continue to be aggressive with the

aerification and fertilizing of the heavily used tee tops. We have started to utilize a wider spacing of tee markers to see if it aids in recovery of those tee tops.

Spring is here and we will be wrapping up our winter clearing. I am on the fence about how much we accomplished during winter months. We were able to work on many areas that were not touched in the past. However, with some focus still being on Matthew cleanup and the surprisingly warm winter (causing more mowing), I do not believe we accomplished as much as we could have. Work will continue in these areas until sustained warm temperatures turn our focus to mowing, edging, and cultural/ agronomic practices.

I would like to end by thanking Mr. Stansfield for donating a beautiful Norfolk Pine tree. We planted the tree in front of the restroom on number 3. With the loss of the Magnolias in that area, it was the perfect spot! I look forward to watching it grow for years to come!

# From the Golf Shop By: Billy VanArsdale

If you have played two to three times a week over the last year please let me look over the condition of your grips. Not only do the new materials wear out quicker they also hold dirt and oil from our sandy ground conditions and our hands. Summer temps are right around the corner and all the sweat from your hands end up getting trapped in the grips. This leads to slick grips and your hands have to tighten up to pre-vent the club from slipping during your swing. Any time your hands hold to tight you are costing your-self swing speed and the ability to release the club properly. Loss of distance and pushed shots just because of your equipment. If you play more than twice a week your clubs need to be re-

gripped every year. Cleaning the grips is necessary every 3 -4 months. With the exception of manufacturer styles our vendor offers one day delivery and in most cases I will have the clubs re-gripped over-night and ready for use the next day! The next time you play, bring your clubs in for evaluation or call if you have club storage and I will be glad to take a look at them. If your clubs only need to be cleaned we will clean them for a charge of \$15.00. New grips range from \$7.00 to \$15.00 per club. Some specialty putter grips are slightly higher. Don't cost yourself strokes when it can be avoided!


