Turf Talk

"On July 14th, I celebrated my three year anniversary at Grand Haven...it has gone fast!"

During the month of July we received the second highest rain total for 2017. Nearly 4 inches fell...that is not much compared to the 11.4 in June, but we will happily take it! As I write this newsletter, there is a high percentage chance of rain for the last few days of the month.

The last greens aerification of the year will take place on August 13th and 14th. The previous two went extremely well and we expect the same from this one. We will also be applying 13 tons of fertilizer to the golf course as we begin preparations for the Fall. This will take place at the end of August or early September, depending on weather. On August 16th I will be flying to Portland, Oregon for the Web.com Tour Portland Open at Pumpkin Ridge. I am excited for the opportunity to work the event, as well as the ability to see a new part of the country. I will return

from Portland on August 28th. I will be sure to take a lot of pictures!

On July 14th, I celebrated my three year anniversary at Grand Haven...it has gone fast! During those three years I have begun to notice reoccurring themes or patterns that happen on the golf course. One of those patterns is that when the grass starts growing, we struggle to keep up with non-turf areas such as bunkers. Beginning in July and continuing into August, much focus will be put on getting the bunkers back into shape. Temporary workers were brought in on July 31st to give us a push in the right direction. The other reoccurring theme or pattern is that when the grass starts growing, our equipment starts failing! Many of you have noticed the sub-par quality of cut in the rough. The rough unit and tractor are currently the oldest pieces of

equipment on property. Much time, effort, and money has been put into the rough mower along with the tractor that pulls it. However, we have found ourselves in a place that it cannot be fixed anymore! To combat this, Escalante Golf has approved the purchase of a new, top of the line, rough unit! We will also be getting a new tractor to tow it! I have attached pictures for you all to see. Along with the tractor and rough unit, we will also see delivery of a new topdresser and tow behind aerifier. With these four pieces of equipment coming, we will have replaced every piece of equipment in my three years at Grand Haven, along with adding a few pieces! We are beyond excited to see what the new equipment is capable of!

Watching "The Open" reminds us all about the importance of knowing the rules of our game. When Jordan Speith sliced his tee shot on the 13th hole I thought he was done. Boy was I wrong. By using the rule that allows a player to take an unplayable lie with a one stroke penalty he came away making a spectacular bogey, keeping himself in the hunt. The rest is history. The U.S.G.A. rule book seems difficult to interpret but if you really just try to visualize

the penalty situations it refers to they are really not difficult. If you really would like to learn the rules I will be glad to help. First if you don't have a rule book let me know. We have books here plus it only takes a few days to order if you want your own personal copy. Next let me pick 2 situations a month out for you. You may see something similar on TV during a tournament or you may have situations that happened to you during a round and you were unsure of the rule and

the procedure. Then we will go over the rule(s) thoroughly and during the rounds you play that month look for the rules situation each time you play the course. Once you put the rule you are trying to learn into practical use they will become easy to understand and learn. Some of you already do this, I commend you for wanting to learn the rules and play the game the way we are all supposed to, BY THE BOOK!

The Handicap Committee must verify that all acceptable scores are reported for handicap purposes, and that recorded scores are available for peer review. An essential element of the USGA Handicap System is the Handicap Committee. Each golf club or authorized golf association utilizing the USGA Handicap System must appoint a Handicap Committee to ensure the integrity of each Handicap Index it issues. This Committee must make certain that the members comply with the USGA Handicap System.


We finished the month with a great tournament benefiting the Flagler County Education Foundation's S.T.U.F.F. Bus. The Bus could barely close the doors

The Hub of the Club

Well August is here and so is the heat! I wanted to take this time to mention food minimums as we are now in the middle of the third quarter of the year. If you are on a quarterly food minimum you have until the end of the September to meet your requirement.

Food minimums are an important part of what helps support Grand Haven's restaurant. There are several options available on how your food minimum is billed.

For members who are here year round the monthly billing is your best option. Social members have a \$40.00/month commitment and single golfing members have a \$30.00/month commitment and family golfing members have a \$50.00/month commitment.

For members who travel frequently you may opt to have your minimum set at a quarterly rate. This option allows you additional time to use your minimum, however it does increase the minimum by \$15.00 per quarter. The final option is for members who are gone at least 6 months out of the year. If you qualify for this option, your food minimum

can be spread out over a period of twelve months. The amount is \$480 for a social member, \$360 for a single golfing member, and \$600 for a family golfing member.

The key to food minimums is communication. You can locate your food minimum on the <http://grandhaven.szencconnect.com> site under your account tab. You will find what you have spent, what your food minimum commitment is, and how much you have remaining. If you will be gone or have a question please call me prior to the end of the month. It is possible to change your food minimum commitment level during a calendar year. My office is always open and I can be reached via phone or email.

So, come have lunch, dinner or grab a bite at the Turn house, anything food related and non-alcoholic beverages count toward your minimum. Also note that if you play in certain tournaments, a portion of your entry fee may count as well. As a reminder: tax, tip and service charges are not counted toward your food minimum.

The MGA will be holding the annual "Boys of Summer" Tournament for league members on August 2nd and 9th. The "Boys of Summer" Tournament divides the playing field into two teams created through a Captain's draft. It is like a Ryder Cup format in which the winning team is the team that collects the largest number of points during the two-week tournament. A "Boys of Summer" Luncheon will be held immediately following the final round on August 9th. The team captains will determine team names and the color of shirts the team will wear for the tournament.

The team captains for this year's event are Pete Bianchi and Joe Palermo (three time defending captains) and Bill Boyer and Mike Rowlands. They will attend a draft with the Tournament Director after sign-ups are completed, (players must sign up by 2 pm Wednesday, July 26, 2016). We need your help! Due to the prolonged drought conditions we are experiencing this year, it is more important than ever to observe our golf cart usage guidelines. With your help, we can reduce the amount of stress we add from cart traffic and maintain the best turf conditions. Green 4x4 posts have been installed indicating where you should exit the fairway to the cart path along with traffic control ropes and stakes where needed.

- Observe the 90 degree rule
- Obey the Green Post and exit the fairway to the cart path
- Keep carts on the cart path around all tees and greens
- Handicap flag carts should keep the cart at least 30 feet from the green, avoid slopes and limit the travel to the shortest route possible
- Scatter cart traffic when entering and exiting the fairway
- Always buddy up in carts when possible

Forward Tees, Please

Forward tees are becoming increasingly popular, providing golfers with quick, fun rounds and potentially lower scores. Here are some important facts every golfer should know about forward tees.

Forward tees can provide a challenge commensurate to your abilities.

Forward tees are not intended to make a golf course easy; rather, they are intended to enhance the golf experience by allowing golfers to adjust the length and difficulty of a golf course so that it is compatible with their abilities. Although a few golfers can hit a golf ball extraordinarily far, most golfers hit the ball much shorter distances than the professionals on TV. Often, golfers with slower swing speeds are unable to reach putting greens *in regulation* not because they lack skill, but simply because they do not hit the ball very far. Properly positioned forward tees can solve this problem by appropriately matching course length with golfer ability.

Playing from forward tees can be fast and fun.

You can play faster and achieve better scores when playing a golf course that is aligned with your abilities. Playing from forward tees can leave you with fewer hybrid or long iron approach shots into greens, improving your accuracy, score and enjoyment while possibly reducing the potential of losing balls.

You can post scores from forward tees to the USGA Handicap System®.

Provided they offer a course that plays at least 3,000 yards for 18 holes, forward tees can be evaluated by your state or regional golf association to receive a Course Rating® and Slope Rating®. Once rated, you can post scores from forward tees to receive or maintain a Handicap Index®. Since the Ratings for forward tees are based on a shorter total yardage, your Handicap Index will remain transferrable from one set of tees to another and from course to course.

Creating forward tees is easier than you think.

Whether new tees are constructed or tee markers simply are placed in a level area of a fairway, creating forward tees at your course does not need to be expensive or time-consuming. Often, forward tees can be established in fairways without requiring additional maintenance operations or construction costs. Even with a limited budget, forward tees are not out of reach at your course.
