GOLF CART GUIDELINES

1. Observe the 90 degree rule
2. Obey the green post and exit the fairway to the cart path
3. Keep carts on the cart path around all tees and greens and on all par 3's.
4. Handicap flag carts should keep the cart at least 30 feet from the green as much as possible. avoid slopes and limit travel to the shortest route possible.
5. Scatter cart traffic when entering and exiting the fairway
6. Always buddy up in carts. No single riders unless in a threesome.

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT TJ WEST



The theme for the summer seems to be hot and wet! The course has recorded 9.8" of rain so far in July with one more day to go! As I write this newsletter, we have not run the irrigation system in 19 days! The year to date rain total is 48.55" of rain! Since May of 2017 we have recorded over 10 feet of rain! However, the course is holding up well!

The wet weather caused us to cancel the aerification of greens on July 22nd and 23rd. After being fortunate with the weather for last 3 years...we have been forced to reschedule two so far in 2018. Our next scheduled aerification is August 19th and 20th. We have scheduled the third aerification for September 16th and 17th. Hopefully Mother Nature will cooperate!

There has been much discussion about greens speed. I have attached an article from the USGA that talks about Summer stresses and the cooperation from golfers that is needed. There are times, especially in our current weather pattern, that the turf needs to be protected. We are currently looking at some equipment and accessories that will keep the turf healthy and help it perform better! Having healthy turf is the goal, now we can tweak our practices to aid in playability!

On August 8th, I fly to Portland, Oregon for the Web.com WinCo Foods Portland Open. I will be gone for 11 days as I help the agronomic team at Pumpkin Ridge prepare for this event! Working events like this and the Houston Open are an honor and a lot of hard work! By Escalante sending me to these tournaments, I am able to see things done on different varieties of turf in different parts of the country and implement a few of the practices at Grand Haven!

Last week, we had our Executive team and owners on property! The visit was phenomenal! Thank you for all the kind words that you all said about the team at golf maintenance! They saw good turf conditions, but an overall lack of detail. They left Grand Haven with a mission to get us more staff and some more key equipment pieces! We are currently working on renovating the clubhouse landscape and more importantly, the irrigation system! The landscape will be simple, effective, and easy to maintain! Two contractors have been on property to view the scope of work, with two more scheduled for this week! I have a ton of respect and admiration for the Escalante team and ownership! How Does Summer Heat Stress Affect My Game? June 2, 2017 By

Golfers can help superintendents protect the putting greens during hot weather by being patient with maintenance practices that help turf survive heat stress.

Regardless of the weather, superintendents frequently are asked to push putting green turf to its limit to meet player expectations. Superintendents face a real dilemma during hot summer weather: continue pushing for fast green speeds and risk turf damage, or err on the side of safety by raising mowing heights and risk complaints about slower green speeds. Superintendents walk a fine line between these choices in an effort to provide quality summer playing conditions. However, when conditions dictate, they must be prepared to make adjustments that protect long-term health and playability of the putting greens.

One adjustment superintendents make to protect the putting greens during hot weather is raising the mowing height. Mowing at low heights is a common practice to achieve



fast green speeds. Unfortunately, low mowing heights also leave very little leaf area available for photosynthesis. During periods of hot weather, turfgrass that is mown extremely low will struggle to produce enough energy and can quickly decline.

Furthermore, ultralow mowing heights during hot weather makes turf vulnerable to disease and reduces its ability to tolerate other stresses such as insects, traffic, drought, shade and poor drainage. As a result, there is a serious risk of turf loss, which can lead to bumpy playing conditions and lost revenue. At minimum, extra resources will be needed to maintain acceptable putting green quality when heat-stressed turf is mown extremely low.

Golfers can help keep putting greens healthy and smooth during hot weather by being patient with temporarily slower green speeds. A well-timed, conservative decision to raise the mowing height could be the difference between healthy and dead putting greens.

Next time you see a superintendent checking putting greens on an extremely hot afternoon, be sure to express interest and understanding in the steps that are being taken to protect the putting greens from summer heat stress. Working together is the best way to protect a golf course.

If you have played golf and watched the game for a long time you probably remember an Taiwanese Touring Professional named T.C. Chen. He enjoyed moderate success in the 80's and even the Los Angeles Open in 1987. In the 1985 U.S. Open he was leading the event during the 4th round when he hit his second shot in the deep rough beside the putting surface. He then hit the infamous shot that gave him the nickname "Two Chip" Chin. The rough was so thick and he was trying to be as delicate as possible when he swung and as the ball was flying out his club was slowed down so much by the thick rough he hit the ball again as it was flying. The ball was hit so hard by his club it went back and to the left of the putting surface from 5 yards away. The double hit resulted in adding one stroke penalty to his score for the hole. He was so rattled by the events he ended up making a quadruple bogey on the hole and only lost the tournament by 1 stroke.

One of the new rule changes that will be in effect in 2019 takes this penalty away. No longer will you have to take a 1 stroke penalty for a "double hit" you only count it as the original stroke and play the ball as it lies. You may access all the new rule changes on the U.S.G.A. website.

FROM THE OFFICE ADMINISTRATOR AMANDA HOLDEN



I have fielded phone calls and have had some members stop in with questions regarding how to read their statements. The statement consists of 4 basic parts; The "Previous Balance", "Purchases", "Payments/Credits", and "Balance Due". These boxed sections are found above the list of account activity. The "Previous Balance" shows the previous month's bill total. "Purchases" show the total dollar amount of what charges occurred during the current month. "Payments/Credits" are any payments or credits placed on your account during the current month. Finally, "Balance Due" shows any amount owing on the account as of the date of your statement.

To the right is the boxed sections is the account activity which gives you a line item by line item detail of the when, what, and how much. Any charges placed on your member account and any payments/credits applied to your account will show here. All account activity is shown in date order from the first of the month down to the last day of the month.

When reconciling your statement, you should be able to take the Previous Balance, add any purchases listed, subtract out any Payment/Credits showing and the itemized list should equal what is showing in the "Balance Due" box. I have included an example of a member statement for reference.

Keep in mind, the balance due is what will be charged to your credit card account or withdrawn from your checking account between the 1st and the 5th of the following month. For example, the July, 2018 Member Statement balance will be paid using the preferred payment method on your member account between August 1st – 5th.

As always, if you have any questions or concerns in regards to your monthly statement or have questions during the month in regards to a specific charge, let me know! Contact me directly via my email address – aholden@grandhavengc.com or call the club at 386-445-2327, option 7. You can also stop by the office Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. till 4:30 p.m.

The MGA will be holding the annual "Boys of Summer" Tournament for league members on August 1st and 8th. When You Hear Thunder, Lightning is Near!

Immediately head indoors!

Seek

- » Large, permanent building
- » Fully-enclosed metal vehicle (cars, vans or pickup trucks)
- » Lowest elevation area

Avoid

- » Tall Objects (trees/poles)
- » Small rain and sun shelters
- » Large, open areas
- » Wet areas
- » Elevated areas
- » All metal objects including, golf clubs, golf carts, fences, electrical and maintenance machinery and power lines.

If sudden, close-in lightning does not permit immediate evacuation to a safer place, spread out from your group, squat down, tuck your head and cover your ears. Head for the safest place as soon as immediate threat passes.

Discontinuing Play in Competitions

The USGA emphasizes that players in a competition have the right to stop play if they think lightning threatens them, even though the committee may not have authorized it specifically by signal, (Rules 6-8 and 33-2d).


