## Turf Talk By: TJ West, Superintendant

The weather pattern for this continued in Winter January ... dry a n d 2.17" of rain was warm! recorded, however 1.6" of that fell on January 7th. With the rain total in January, we have received exactly 3" of rainfall since Hurricane Matthew. We only saw two frost days during January. The coldest morning, 36 degrees, was January 31st. During January of 2015 we recorded 4 frost days with a few of those days in the low 30s. February is usually one of the coldest months in our area of Florida. However, as I write this newsletter, the first two weeks of the month look fantastic!

We are still mowing grass, but at a much less frequency. We are currently mowing rough biweekly, tees/fairways are being mowed one time weekly, and greens are being mowed as needed based on air temperature. Mornings below 45 degrees we are rolling greens instead of mowing. This helps in protecting the plant from possible damage. The frequency of all mowing will continue to be adjusted based on the weather. We have

scheduled the first of 4 bulk fertilizer applications for the second w e e k o f February. One application a month will be performed from February to May. The turf has stayed reasonably and has held up green well. We will continue to battle the wear on the tee boxes and cart traffic In fall of 2016 we areas. began closing random tee boxes earlier than past years. It has worked, to a degree. I am aware that some tee boxes will get worn out no matter what is done. Cold weather substantially hurts the recovery time. We will continue to patch these areas with sand and give them more attention as we progress toward Spring.

Many members have talked to me in reference to etiquette of fellow golfers. I have attached an article from The USGA

http://www.usga.org/coursecare/regional-updates/westregion/2017/new-year-sresolutions-for-the-puttinggreens.html that talks about practices to both do and avoid on greens. A few of the other etiquette requests are... Please fill and smooth

a divot after a shot is hit. Please enter/exit a bunker from the low side and rake the bunker after a shot is Please adhere to tee hit. locations as we continue to protect areas. Please adhere to ropes/stakes and directional signs. Please use the 90 degree rule and avoid driving near tees and greens. Following these few details will go a long way in making a round of golf more enjoyable for all!

Shaw Tree Service will remain on property until February 8th. They are done a great job so far! Although Shaw will remove a bulk of the trees/debris, there will be some areas that we will have to address ourselves. I am aware that because of their equipment size, some cart paths have been damaged. We knew this may happen before the project began and Shaw will fix many of the areas upon completion of the tree project.

Spring is coming and we are looking forward to the return of "growing weather"!

### The Hub of the Club By Sarah Wells

For this month's topic I am going to address ways you can be proactive in understanding your Grand Haven statements.

Each member, when you joined, should have been given a login and password to our membership site, www.grandhavengc.com. This site is live with your member charges and you can view your statements at any given time to see how much food minimum you have remaining or what has been charged to your account for cart fees and green fees. If you have lost this login or never received one just stop by my office or give me a call and I can get this set up. Also from this Web site you can make online dinner reservations. This is extremely helpful to us but also for you. If you make a reservation online then you will receive a confirmation email letting you know when you reservation has been made. This saves you from having to leave a voicemail when the restaurant is busy. You can also make a

reservation without logging into the Web site by sending your request to <u>ghreserva-</u><u>tions@grandhavengc.com</u>.

To view your statement just click on "Club News" up at the top of the page and you should see a link that says "Member Statement". Once here you would login with your statement login credentials. You then can click on the "My Account" tab. Here you are able to view your Food Minimum balance, as well as all charges to your account. If you notice anything out of the ordinary or incorrect charges, the sooner you call me the better. I can then correct your statement before the month end billing cycle.
