FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER AND DIRECTOR OF GOLF ANDREA KNOX



With the summer heat upon us; we have a fun and fast golf event planned to kick off your Fourth of July celebration. The Scramble String Tournament format allocates each team a length of string for their handicap. The string is used to advance your golf ball for free but each time you use it, that piece of string gets cut off and discarded. There is no advantage to returning with string left so decide on a strategy and don't forget to bring a pair of scissors. A good old fashion cook out follows golf and you will still have time for a nap and dip in the pool before heading out to watch the fireworks!

I have to laugh every time someone refers to the summer months as our "slow season". While it's true the number of golf rounds go down slightly, we still maintain a full calendar of club activities, the golf course requires the most attention with everything growing like crazy, and we endeavor to catch up on maintenance items, general housekeeping, paperwork and planning that there just aren't enough hours in a day to accomplish during season. Some big projects on our list for the summer include replacing the ice machine at the turn house (which should happen in the next couples of weeks), replacing an air conditioning system in the clubhouse, and fixing the broken concrete cart path by the practice putting green. This past week we completed painting the patio floors around the clubhouse, a nice "freshen up" item to get checked off the list. Of course there are lots of other items on our list and we'll keep you updated as they get moved to a completion schedule.

While I am on the subject of general housekeeping, your help on the following is truly appreciated. Please let us know if you do not complete your round due to rain. Our tee sheet system automatically defaults to 18 hole rounds. So, unless we physically change your round to 9, you will be charged for 18. This can be fixed of course, but it is a whole lot easier to adjust it up front than a month later when you see the charge on your statement. Also, if for some reason there is not someone at bag drop to check you in, please stop in the golf shop before heading out. We need to know who is on the course at all times for our consideration and your safety. This request includes unlimited cart plan holders as well.

If you are an insomniac like so many of us; there is a special treat you should check out this month. The 145th playing of the British Open will begin airing on the Golf Channel at 1:30am (yes- that's 1:30 in the morning) Thursday July 14th and Friday July 15th with continuous coverage until 4pm. Saturday and Sunday coverage begins a little later on NBC so you'll have to find something else to do until 4am. Check out all the history and latest news on The Open at www.theopen.com.

Be sure to tack the July club calendar on your refrigerator so you'll have our full schedule at a glance. Turf Talk By: TJ West

In June we saw our first Tropical Storm of the season. During Colin we received 4 inches of much needed rain! However, only 2.5 inches fell during the rest of June. In our part of Florida it seems that we stay dry until July 4th and then the wet weather begins...fingers crossed!

Our second aerification of tees and greens went well. The hole size on greens mirrored that of the first aerification, but we were much more aggressive on the spacing. The difference is that the spacing of the holes were a $\frac{1}{2}$ inch tighter, both forward and lateral, during the June date. This made the cleanup a more lengthy process and it stretched into the two days following aerification. More sand will be applied to the greens on July 11th. We do not have a scheduled aerification date for July. Our next date is August 7th and 8th.

With the time spent with aerification combined with rapid turf growth, we are behind on the frequency of our detail work. July will be a great month to catch up on the edging of bunkers, irrigation heads, and cart paths. There will also be a big push to clean weeds in perimeter beds and eradicate sedge on the course. Much time is being dedicated to the general cleanup and

improvement of bunkers. The sustained moisture in many bunkers is leading to weed germination in the sand. Even with-



out consistent rain, many bunkers are remaining wet and compacted. You will see us start to investigate the infrastructure of many bunkers. We will be looking for clogged/ crushed drain pipe, as well as other reasons that bunkers are not performing. I have been asked by Escalante to take pictures of our findings to aid in a future renovation project.

You may notice that we removed all the green 4x4 post by the greens. This will be for the summer as traffic control is not as crucial. The purpose of the post is to show where to exit a fairway with the golf cart. As we head into the Winter the post may systematically be put back up.

I would like to thank the membership here at Grand Haven for all the well wishes as I have struggled through a recent health issue. In my opinion, our membership is the beast around! I can be contacted by email, twest@grandhavengc.com, for questions, comments, or concerns.

FROM THE GOLF SHOP BY: BILLY VANARSDALE

If you have played two to three times a week over the last year please let me look over the condition of your grips. Not only do the new materials wear out quicker they also hold dirt and oil from our sandy ground conditions and our hands. Over the next three months we will be playing in extreme heat and all the sweat from your hands end up getting trapped in the grips. This leads to slick grips and your hands have to tighten up to prevent the club from slipping during your swing. Any time your hands hold to tight you are costing yourself swing speed and the ability to release the club properly. Loss of distance and pushed shots just because of your equipment. If you play more than twice a week your clubs need to be re-

gripped every year. Cleaning the grips is necessary every 3-

4 months. With the exception of manufacturer styles our vendor offers one day delivery and in most cases I will have the clubs re-gripped overnight and ready for use the next day! The next time you play, bring your clubs in for evaluation or call if you have club storage and I will be glad to take a look at them. If your clubs only need to be cleaned we will clean them for a charge of \$15.00. New grips range from \$7.00 to \$15.00 per club. Some specialty putter grips are slightly higher. Don't cost yourself strokes when it can be avoided!

SO HOW ARE WE DOING ANYWAY? BY: BILLY WOOD & ROGER CONSOLLA

One of the reasons the Club has a Handicap Committee is so that a golfing peer group helps keep our handicaps relevant and accurate. So we do a sampling of recorded scores and cards. We keep a few stats, just for a sense of the results of the work, and we thought we would share what things look like for the month of June.

We audited almost 1,000 scores (down from the first five months of the year), and found almost 10% not recorded in the required 72 hours postplay. That's much higher than previous and there are a lot of reasons for it, weather issues, pro shop closed, etc.; however, the point is that most

people are posting and we'd ask that you remind each other after a round to post as soon as possible.

We received cards for about 75% of the rounds audited but that number is skewed high due to the required WGA and MGA card submissions. It really helps us to have cards turned in to validate the recorded scores so we hope everyone will make an effort to leave the cards in the pro shop, even though this is voluntary, not a USGA requirement.


THE HUB OF THE CLUB BY: SARAH WELLS

This is a great time to evaluate your spending for the year and make sure you are on track. June 30th marked the end our of second quarter. Our third quarter runs July—September. If you are on an annual food minimum, by now you should have spent at least 1/2 of your minimum in order to not have a remaining balance in December. Making it a point to have a lunch and a dinner at the club goes a long way. Who knows, you might find that during these hot months it is a lot

more appealing to let our staff cook for you, your family and your friends.

There are three different ways you can check your food minimum. The first is to give me a call or send me an email. I do my very best to respond within 24 hours. The second way is to ask a server in the restaurant. If you are having a drink or dining in the club the server can look up your food spending. Keep in mind this total does not include your ticket from that day. The third and most reliable option is to login to your Grand Haven statement account. You will find that once you click on your account information your food minimum, plus your spending and the remaining balance pops up toward the middle of the page. See the picture below.



FROM THE CHEF BY: JEAN-PIERRE ROBERTS



Hello! It's getting hot out there here's a cool recipe to beat the heat.

Watermelon Berry Gazpacho

Serving size: 10 people 8oz servings

Ingredients:

Watermelon.....1/4 of a 10lb melon or 2.5lbs of seedless melon meat cut off the skin.

Strawberry......1pint of fresh strawberries

cleaned and cut

Simple Syrup.....1/2 cup cooled

Crushed ice.....1/2 cup

Fresh Mint Leaf..1 sprig

Procedures:

Cut and clean all fruit, cut all fruit into a med dice for easy blending. In a med sauce pan 2cups of water bring to a boil and pour 1cup of sugar and reduce to ½. (when making simple syrup the sweetness can vary by the amount of sugar you add to the water). Cool simple syrup to 55 degrees. Place the cut fruit in large blender and pulse chop until all fruit is blended, add ice and simple syrup and blend well. Chill and serve in your favorite chilled soup bowl. Garnish with a mint leaf in the center of the gazpacho. There you have a fun chilled start to any great meal. Pair with a healthy spinach, cran-raisin, red onion, candied pecan, and Shrimp, chicken, salmon, or Ahi tuna salad. Remember to taste your food all the way through your cooking procedures.
