Turf Talk By: TJ West, Superintendant

May was another dry month at Grand Haven! We recorded 1.85" of rainfall, 1.15" of that fell the evening of our first greens aerification on May 22nd. With the rainfall total in May, we are now at 11.85" since Hurricane Matthew! We are heading in to the "wet" season and hope to see more steady precipitation! There is no replacement for natural moisture and it is obvious how quick the course greens up after a good rain!

The aerification of greens on May 21st and 22nd went extremely well! As I write this newsletter, they are healing great! With forecasted rain for those two days, we were able to complete 13 greens on Sunday night and finish the process by 3:30pm on Monday. All 21 greens were verticut, mowed, heavily topdressed, aerified, plugs were removed by hand, rolled, sand was drug in, leftover debris was blown off, cups were cut, and three soil amendments/fertilizers were spread...in roughly 16 hours of work! We were also able to mow the front 9 tees, collars, approaches and

fairways, as well as the back 9 rough! I cannot speak highly enough of the job that our maintenance team completed! The next greens aerification is scheduled for June 25th and 26th. I receive many questions about aerification and the reasoning behind the three that we perform. There is a article and a video, both from the USGA, that explains the importance behind the practice at the bottom of the page.

Along with greens aerification, we will aerify tees in June. This Spring, there have already been two aerifications performed to the tees...it has helped. In May of 2016, my newsletter contained explanations of why some tees still closed. This year, has been much better for the tees, therefore all tees are being used. The Blue tee on 14 is healing slowly, but should gain speed as sustained growing temperatures arrive this month. We also have 24,000 pounds of fertilizer set to be spread wall to wall during the first week of the month. You may also notice the green 4x4 posts and more

stakes on the course. This is to protect already stressed turf...as explained in the e-blast. Please help us with traffic patterns! I am systematically replacing rotten boards on bridges. I have found the process to be slow as I figure out the best system. We are admittedly way behind on bunker edging! However, we will dedicate much attention to them going forward! June will be another busy month for the Grand Haven Maintenance team!

Last month we were able to welcome back Brent Courtney as the Assistant Superintendent! He was able to return to full duties after his accident in early March. You may also notice a new face on the course! Scott McCracken was hired to be a 2nd Assistant. Scott has been a Superintendent for many years at various properties in the southeast, including Grand Haven in the early 2000's. Please feel free to say hello to Brent and welcome Scott to Grand Haven!

I and TJ have both written about this in the past but it seems to go unnoticed. It is the responsibility of the player to properly rake the bunker where the shot was played from and the footsteps in and out of the bunker. That simple If you are physically impaired please let us know in the golf shop if you were in a bunker during your round and we will send

someone to repair it. That would be a step in the right direction. If you are not physically impaired there is no excuse for leaving the bunker in a situation that affects another player that day. The beauty of etiquette in the game we all so love is the fact that others should never be affected by other players actions. That has always been what is so good about golf, do the right thing by others. If I am affecting others play I should be the one to remedy it. Etiquette will rule #1.

We need your help! Due to the prolonged drought conditions we are experiencing this year, it is more important than ever to observe our golf cart usage guidelines. With your help, we can reduce the amount of stress we add from cart traffic and maintain the best turf conditions. Green 4x4 posts have been installed indicating where you should exit the fairway to the cart path along with traffic control ropes and stakes where needed.

- Observe the 90 degree rule
- Obey the Green Post and exit the fairway to the cart path
- Keep carts on the cart path around all tees and greens
- Handicap flag carts should keep the cart at least 30 feet from the green, avoid slopes and limit the travel to the shortest route possible
- Scatter cart traffic when entering and exiting the fairway
- Always buddy up in carts when possible
