A couple of reminders please as we are in the peak of our busy season. #1. Please, please, please . . . If there is no personnel at the bag drop when you arrive for golf, please stop in the golf shop to let us know you are here. It is crucial that we know who is on the



course not only for obvious reasons of round counts, fee collection and score posting- but also for your safety. #2. One cart per twosome and 2 carts per three some or foursome please! Not only do we need every cart we have available at this time of year, but this also helps to reduce the wear and tear on the golf course! Cart traffic is the number one reason for thinning turf in high volume areas. The constant traffic compacts the soil and makes it more difficult for water, air and nutrients to penetrate to the roots resulting in weak turf. This is especially important during these winter months as turf is already stressed and recovery is slow. This also plays into #3 Please be conscious of where you are driving. We ask golfers to keep carts on the path at all tee boxes and greens plus the entire length of par three's. Unless you truly have a handicap that does not allow you to follow these guidelines, please be considerate of the turf and playing conditions by being aware of where you drive. A side benefit of course is something we can all use . . . a little exercise!

A shout out of Congratulations to our WPC Women Golfers for retaining the Cup from this year's interclub matches! Nice going ladies!

Turf Talk By: TJ West, Superintendent

I would like to start off by wishing Mr. Cousino a speedy recovery after a recent medical procedure! Mr. Cousino has always given me both positive and negative feedback about course conditions and has made me a better Superintendent because of it! I have a tremendous amount of respect for him and cannot wait to see him back on the course very soon!

It is hard to believe that I am writing the March Newsletter! It seems that the months are flying February brought more precipitation, 2.25", than we had received since October. However, looking at the lakes, we can all tell that it isn't enough! Traditionally in our part of Florida, February is one of the coldest months. In February of 2016 we had three frost days, two of which were below freezing. This year our coldest day was 39 degrees on February 17th and we did not have a single frost day. Winter is winding down and we may see a cold day or two in March, but the likelihood is small.

After the February newsletter went out, a member made me aware of the fact that no one pays attention to what was said about golf course etiquette. That's fine...I would be doing the membership at Grand Haven a huge disservice by not talking about it! The team at Golf Course Maintenance works hard every morning to prepare the course for the play that day. Ultimately it is up to you as members to keep it that way throughout the day! PLEASE fill divots, PLEASE rake your footprints in bunkers, PLEASE enter/exit from the low side of a bunker, PLEASE fix ball marks, PLEASE do not "scuff" your feet when walking across a green, PLEASE keep carts off of

tee and green slopes, PLEASE do not ride directly over tee tops in order to avoid ropes/stakes (didn't think I would ever have to mention this!), PLEASE adhere to the 90 degree rule when leaving the cart path. Following these request will make everyone's experience at Grand Haven more enjoyable and would help us out tremendously. My goal at Grand Haven has been and will always be to have a golf course that we can all be proud of. It is a team effort that takes all members of the Grand Haven family! I work every day in order to achieve that goal! With your cooperation...we can continue to do so...together!

Last month we started our Spring cultural practices. This is due in large part to the warm weather. On February 20th we did a light verticut and topdress on the greens. This is the earliest that I personally have ever verticut! Many of the tee boxes show how busy the course has been. As I write this newsletter, we are aerifying blue, white, and green tee boxes. This will be done on a monthly basis as we work to heal the damaged areas. Besides some of the tee boxes, the course has "wintered" very well. If the March forecast holds true, we will be mowing grass non-stop sooner than in the past. This month we will continue to do more of the same cultural practices as we gear up for a great summer!

Shaw Tree Service completed Hurricane Matthew cleanup on February 7th. We are in the process of addressing many of the areas that Shaw worked in. They were contracted to only trim/remove large trees and grind the stumps. The removal of the underbrush and stumps that they did not grind will be up

to the Golf Maintenance team. Even with the above average temperatures, we are working hard on clearing many non-turf areas. This year the team is doing a phenomenal job with the clearing and I could not be happier! My fear is that Mother Nature will force us to mow at a greater frequency sooner and we may run out of time before we complete all these areas! That scenario can be seen as both a good and a bad thing.

On March 30th, Escalante Golf will host the first round of the Shell Houston Open at The Golf Club of Houston. This year, I was asked by Escalante to be a part of the volunteer staff for tournament week. I am not sure vet what I will be tasked with (raking bunkers, cutting cups, etc.), but I am excited for the opportunity! If all goes according to plan, I will fly out on Saturday March 25th and return home after course preparations are completed for the final round on Sunday April 2nd. Obviously, my responsibilities at Grand Haven come first...things can change between now and then! If I am able to attend, I will be sure to share photos of the experience, in an upcoming newsletter.
