# TURF TALK BY: TJ WEST

It is hard to believe that I am writing a newsletter for October! The first day of Fall has come and gone...2016 is flying by! Mid-October begins the "dry" season here in Florida. I cannot imagine that our weather could get any dryer! In the month of September we received 5.25" of rain. Most of that fell in two tropical systems. September was the second wettest month so far in 2016, behind 6" in June.

October kicks off our tournament season and the rounds of golf will increase substantially. However, as daylight and temperatures begin to decrease, the turf growth will as well. As we progress in to the cooler months, you will notice that more ropes/ stakes will be added and the green 4X4 post will go back up. The purpose of the posts is to show the exit point of the fairway at a spot short of the green. Practices such as ball mark repair and filling divots come to the forefront as well. A bulk fertilizer application, high in Potassium, will be applied wall to wall on October 3rd. Like in the human body, Potassium strengthens the cell wall. It also aids in photosynthesis, holding color, respiration, etc. Potassium is an essential nutrient and we apply it on a regular basis. However, a higher rate is key to a stronger healthier plant heading into the Fall/Winter.

I have been told and have noticed that the wood lines are creeping in. Brazilian Pepper trees and vines have become a

huge issue. In 2015, the weather was extremely warm during the months of October through December. We were still mowing grass on a regular schedule in to the second week of January. This caused us to focus on line of sight issues and not much else. Thinning out areas has already begun and will be a major focus going forward!

Bunkers...need I say more? As discussed in many prior newsletters, this Summer much time and effort has been spent on bunkers. Many different tactics have been used to help the playability and the appearance. The addition of sand to key bunkers throughout the course will begin soon! I have also been given confirmation that a new John Deere bunker machine has been ordered and we should be receiving it soon! We are progressing forward and I look forward to improving on non-turf areas!


### FROM THE GOLF SHOP BY: BILLY VANARSDALE






# THE HUB OF THE CLUB BY: SARAH WELLS




# LGLGH (LADIES GOLF LEAGUE OF GRAND HAVEN)

### KITCHEN CORNER By: Chef JP Roberts

Hey Y'all its Chef with 21 Fall cocktails that will be the talk of your next party. Just as in cooking we infuse and layer flavors. You can do so in drink making. The list of drink selections I have chosen for you are going to keep you current and keep people talking about your party for weeks.

Enjoy the list, pick out your favorites, and let me know when the next event at your house is.

Cucumber-Apple Collins: Gin sour made with apple, cucumber, and savory artichoke bitters.

By the Fireside: spices nutmeg and cinnamon into this cocktail made with jammy Croft ten-year tawny port, lemon juice, and Café du Monde chicory coffee.

**Making Love at Midnight:** "fall piña colada." The base is flavorful Rhum Barbancourt, and the flavors veer toward herbal and comforting thanks to the inclusion of Krogstad aquavit and Suze.

**Dill:** anise-y dill, which is infused into Calle 23 blanco tequila paired with earthy matcha syrup, tapioca pearls, and soothing horchata. It's like a boozy bubble tea for leaf-peeping season.

**Back to Capistrano:** Concord grapes in this drink made with Peruvian pisco, Bols Genever, cinnamon syrup, savory sorghum syrup, and molasses-like demerara syrup.

Fall Line: cucumber-and-lemon-basil-infused vodka, easygoing manzanilla sherry, yuzu, lime, and spicy ginger beer for a kick.

**Quartz Mountain:** For this one, barrel-aged Old Tom gin is mixed with Foro Amaro, bonded apple brandy, and dry vermouth, and given a heavy dose of fall via star anise and BT Parsons's spiced cranberry bitters.

Baijiu Bijou: the clear Chinese spirit baijiu with potent green Chartreuse and sweet vermouth, then garnishing the drink with a lemon peel and cherry.

**Tingling Negroni:** There's gin, of course, but the Campari is replaced by Aperol and Cynar, the vermouth by pine-cone liqueur, and the "tingling oil" made with numbing Sichuan peppercorns.

Chock Full O'Nuts: Served in a coffee carafe with a pair of mugs, it's a combination of Old Overholt and Wild Turkey 101 ryes, Contratto Bianco vermouth, and apple and walnut.

The Testimonial: JM BLanc and El Dorado rums, then mixing the spirits with Rothman & Winter Apricot Liqueur and lemon juice in a coupe washed with Aberlour A'Bunadh single-malt Scotch.

Ricky's Charm: cognac with fruity applejack, relatively gentle Amaro Montenegro, apricot liqueur, and fragrant allspice bitters.

Santa Maria: Barr Hill gin, rose vermouth (housemade, of course), Buil y Gine orange vermouth, and Eve's Cidery Bitter Aperitif Cider, essentially vermouth made from cider.

Day After Amaro: mild Montenegro with bittersweet Cynar, honey syrup, bourbon, and lemon-ginger bitters.

Like a Bosc: citrusy Dorthy Parker gin, bitter Campari, and sweet, fruity pear cider for a classic seasonal touch.

Train's a Comin': Dolin Blanc vermouth, lemon juice, Creme Yvette, and cognac. The glass is rinsed in absinthe, too, for a hint of licorice.

Casual Magic: Old Forester bourbon is paired with Pierre Ferrand cognac, pineapple syrup for fruity sweetness, and bitters.

Exit Strategy: Powers Gold Irish whiskey, sweet and raisiny Pedro Ximénez sherry, La Quintinye vermouth rouge, jammy fig, lemon, and celery.


Autumn's Edge: Ford's gin, Dolin Génépy, apple juice, lemon juice, ginger, and dandelion burdock bitters.

**Persimmon-Cognac Cobbler:** Cognac is the base of this drink made with spicy cinnamon syrup, vanilla extract, persimmon purée, and maple syrup.

**J. Pina:** High West Campfire (a blend of rye whiskey, Scotch, and bourbon) with Amargo-Vallet, sherry, Angostura bitters, and a piña "tea" syrup made by infusing simple syrup with pineapple.

## FUN GOLF FACTS

### Getting A Hole-In-One

Each year, approximately 490 million rounds of golf are played around the world. Out of those millions of rounds, how many holes-in-one happen? The answer is 150,000. Those chances are 12,500-to-one for the amateur golfer — but for the pro, they're about 5 times better, or 2,500-to-one. The hole-in-one, or "ace," is like the home run of golf — this rare event is the ultimate symbol of mastery in a sport characterized by careful skill development.

### Defying the Odds

Only a few athletes have defied these odds and delivered the hole-in-one, sometimes under especially impressive circumstances. Mancil Davis, for instance, holds the record for most holes-in-one, having hit 51 of them in his career. Tiger Woods made his first hole-in-one at age six. Kassandra Komma beat odds of 64 million-to-one by hitting two holes-in-one in the course of nine holes.

Although not known for his holes-in-one, Richard Lewis has set his own records in the sport by playing 11,000 holes of golf over the course of 2010, the most ever played in a year. Each round was played at the Four Seasons Resort and Club in Irving, Texas. (Brand loyalty, or could they not get him to leave?) Although many people have gotten holes-in-one, not many can do so on a course intended to be completed in five hits. The Condor is another hole-in-one-related feat, achieved by hitting an ace on a par-five, or a course where a hole is expected in no less than five hits. This is a rare occurrence indeed, only having been made and verified four times in golf history.




