TURF TALK BY: TJ WEST

August was another hot/dry month! We recorded 3" of rainfall, however 2.5" of that fell in one day at the beginning of the month. (As I write this newsletter, we are expecting a tropical system). The last greens aerification went extremely well! Due to forecasted rain on our aerification dates, instead of "running a marathon", it was a sprint to the finish. The staff was able to aerify 14 greens on Sunday afternoon/evening (10 had been our previous record). This made the following day a little easier for us. With all the work completed on Sunday, we were also able to clear the line of sight issues on holes 5, 6, and 7, as well as repair the cart path on number 1. It was a very productive day!

The maintenance staff has continued to work diligently on the details of the course. After being shorthanded for most of the summer, I feel that we are finally catching up! While turf conditions have stayed strong, the lack of detail work had been I have even received a few hurting us! compliments on the bunkers...I am almost passed out! In all seriousness, much time and effort is being put in to the bunkers! We have implemented a new raking style and program that has helped the playability, but not the look. Sand has been added to a few, with more in need of it! Adding sand is a short term fix to a long term problem. We will continue to work on solving the long term problem!

This summer has been a struggle to keep our older equipment running and cutting well! Even without much rain, the grass is growing fast! We just received shipment of two fairway mowers, two greens/tee mowers, and a tow behind blower. Escalante sent us these from their course in Sonoma, CA. They are in great shape and we are more than excited to have them! We are work-

ing on replacing some other key pieces.

In September you will start to see the tee's playing different yardages. The goal is to begin protecting the heavily used tee's early! It is my belief that doing so will help them throughout the Winter. It will be

New flowers have been planted by the front entrance! I apologize for waiting so long to do this! With the heat of the summer and repeated irrigation issues, I did not feel comfortable investing in new plantings. We were able to hammer out the irrigation issues (old wiring)! Even after two years at Grand Haven, much of my time is still spent trying to "undo" the wrongs of the past.

I would like to thank John Douglas and the MGA for purchasing RTIC cups for the maintenance staff! The cups have helped the staff combat the hot summer with cold beverages! I have said in the past, the membership at Grand Haven cannot be beat!


We love to celebrate milestones here at Grand Haven. One of those many


LGLGH (LADIES GOLF LEAGUE OF GRAND HAVEN)


