It seems like summer flew by a lot faster than normal this year. July and August were really the only two months where we experienced normal summertime temperatures. Now as we head into the fall, between the consistent rainfall and the improved coverage of the new irrigation system the course is as lush as I can remember. I don't think I'm overstating things when I say this is the best tee-to-green grass coverage I have seen in my 18 years at Berkeley Hills.

Regarding the greens themselves, they've made good progress throughout the summer, but they are not up to my expectations yet. After a cold and wet spring and early summer, it's been a balancing act to try and deliver fast,



playable conditions while also still being in the first year of the grow-in when we're wanting the grass to spread out and thicken up as much as possible.

When I compare this process to the one we went through 18 years ago when we switched from bentgrass to Champion Bermuda, our new TifEagle has matured so far in a similar way when comparing it to the look, firmness, speed and roll we experienced in the first year of growing in the Champion. For those members who were around back then, you'll recall that by year three of having the Champion in place we were starting to see the super speeds we became known in the area for. So, while we're not where I want to be yet, every day is a step in the right direction and I can't wait for what the future holds.

Looking ahead, you'll start to notice some changes in our agronomy practices this month. September is when we begin to reduce the amount of growth regulator on the fairways, tees, approaches and greens. We actually already began the process of raising mower blade heights and reducing the growth regulator on the greens after the Club Championship in August to promote greens growth and overall health heading into fall and winter.

There are still some slightly thin areas on the greens resulting from the low cutting heights and all the rain we had this year. I want those areas to fill in as much as possible between now and the time the grass goes dormant. We are doing the raising and reducing in slow increments, so golfers shouldn't experience a drastic change in greens speed. There will not be one day they are rolling 11.5 and the next day rolling 8. I do expect you'll see some difference in speed, but not a lot. This is a necessary process we have to follow so we do not get caught with our pants down going into winter. We began the summer at .075" and mowed at that height until August, and we will have backed that off to .150" by the end of September. But once cooler temperatures arrive and growth slows, we'll see the speed pick back up.

We will also raise the heights on fairways from 3/8" to $\frac{1}{2}$ ", tees from $\frac{1}{2}$ " to $\frac{3}{4}$ ", roughs from 1" to $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", and approaches from $\frac{1}{4}$ " to $\frac{1}{2}$ " during September. This will help lesson the impact of cart and foot traffic and prepare us for play during the upcoming winter months.

I look forward to seeing everyone enjoying fall golf this month and next. It's a great time to play golf in Georgia. As always, if you have any questions, please reach out.

ADDITION BY SUBTRACTION

Both golfers and golf course superintendents have a love / hate relationship with trees. On one hand, tall mature pines and majestic hardwoods serve to enhance the aesthetic of golf courses and increase both their beauty and challenge. And on the other hand, the presence of an overgrown tree or one poorly positioned on a hole serves to frustrate many a golfer unfairly, while also preventing superintendents from growing the quality of turf desired on roughs, fairways and greens. From blocking sunlight, to inhibiting proper air circulation, to robbing the soil of nutrients turfgrass needs to thrive, trees and their root systems make growing grass, especially golf turfgrass, an impossible proposition in many instances. Indeed, as a thoughtful individual once observed, there's a reason you don't see much grass in a forest, and you don't see many trees on a prairie.

Part of the long-term plan for the golf course at Berkeley Hills involves the limbing of certain trees to raise their canopy and improve sunlight and air circulation on the turf below. At the same time, other trees have been designated for removal, in order to improve both the playability and turf conditions of certain holes. We are excited to announce that on the week of September 19th (weather permitting), an extensive tree limbing and removal project will take place in accordance with this plan. During this week crews will be working throughout the golf course, and play on certain holes may be disrupted at certain times of the day.

Funding for this project comes via a combination of club capital savings funds, as well as a substantial individual contribution provided by a Berkeley Hills member. On behalf of the Berkeley Hills membership we express our appreciation for the contribution to enhance the course's playability and turf conditioning, and we appreciate everyone's patience while the project is completed.

After being closed for the past few years, we're excited to announce the reopening of the downstairs men's lounge, affectionally known as The Bunker!


