



August Meeting Country Club of Scranton

Host: Greg Boring, GCS

Our Annual Clambake and Scholarship Fundraiser Tournament takes us to one of Northeast PA's truly historic and beautiful golf courses in the Country Club of Scranton. The club, started in 1896, was originally located in downtown Scranton on the site of Marywood University. In 1926 they moved the site to their current location with the 18 hole course being designed by Walter Travis. With an extensive membership of over 600, the 18 hole course could not meet the demands of the members; so in 1989 a new 9 holes (The Falls), were constructed under the architectural supervision of Michael Hurzdan.

Known for its difficult, sloping greens, C.C. of Scranton has hosted many tournaments over the years. Three PA State Amateurs, a PA State Open, and the Anthracite Open, which boasted players such as Ben Hogan, Sam Snead, and Gene Sarazen. This year C.C. of Scranton hosted a US Open qualifier, as well, which just happened to have the highest qualifying score of any location (76). They are also slated to hold the Senior PA State Amateur this August and the State Amateur in 2015.

As with most of the established courses in our area, the fairways, greens, and tees are all a poa/bent mix. The course plays to a par 72 at 7,000 yards from the tips and is protected by 62 bunkers. The 27 hole property boasts 4 acres of greens, 4 acres of tees, and 44 acres of fairways.

Research to Reality:

Soil Microbes and Turfgrass

Soil microbiology is the study of the biology and function of microorganisms in soil, and their affect on soil properties and plant life. Dr. David Zuberer, Professor of Soil Microbiology at Texas A&M (College Station, TX), lists the following turfgrass soil/ root zone variables that influence the growth of soil microbes (in no particular order):

Soil Parameter Source/Desired Range • organic carbon grass clippings, stems, root exudates, organic wastes, etc. adequate N, P, K, etc. • inorganic nutrients

6 to 8 (~near neutral optimal) • pH

50 to 104 °F • temperature

 moisture 50% water-filled soil pores

balance of air-filled and water-filled soil aeration

pores

Research shows that turfgrass soils are similar to agricultural or native grassland soils in terms of microbial function, and that the turfgrass rootzone environment is favorable for the growth of soil microbes. In fact, after 35 years of work, Dr. Zuberer concludes that the "best practices for managing soil microbes [in turfgrass ecosystems] are those that adhere to well-established agronomic principles" and that "healthy turf will provide the necessary resources for soil microbes to thrive".

How can golf course turf professionals use this information? As Dr. Zuberer stated, employ sound agronomic/cultural practices. Also utilize various plant and soil health products that are verified by research, in order to facilitate and maintain a soil rootzone environmental favorable for soil microbes that exist in the thin water films or "biofilms" surrounding soil particles.

Since 2009, shortly after Greg's arrival at Scranton, the course has undergone some major renovations and improvements. In the fall of 2009 all of the greens had new drainage installed via the XGD System. In July of 2011 the Club embarked on a major renovation project that includes the complete rebuilding of all 62 bunkers on the 18 hole course, the re-contouring of some fairways, construction of some forward tees, and the addition of 2.5 acres of tightly mowed greens surrounds/collection areas, as seen in the picture on the right. Oh, and I can't fail to mention that Greg and his crew have also overseen the removal of more than 2,500 trees through his years there as well. Since our last visit to Scranton, the driving range has also been completely renovated. All these renovations have led to C.C. of Scranton now being ranked in the Top 100 Classical Golf Courses in the United States.

Greg, an Ohio State grad who interned at Oakmont, has been superintendent at C.C. of Scranton since January 2008. He came to Scranton having previously worked as a superintendent at neighboring Glen Oak C.C. for a stint of 3 years. Before that, he spent 2 years as the assistant at Preakness Hills C.C. in NJ and 3 years as an assistant in Florida.

As you can imagine, this sizeable property takes a sizeable staff to keep it in tip-top shape. The in season crew of 35 has 4 employees with Turf degrees, including Assistants Tom Height and Jeff Wilbur, along with long time employee and now equipment manager Charlie Saxe.

I certainly hope you have the opportunity to get away and play this course (which we will be getting the pleasure of playing the day after Greg's 3 day Member/Guest) and catch up with some peers as the season quickly continues.
