



Centennial Year In Review

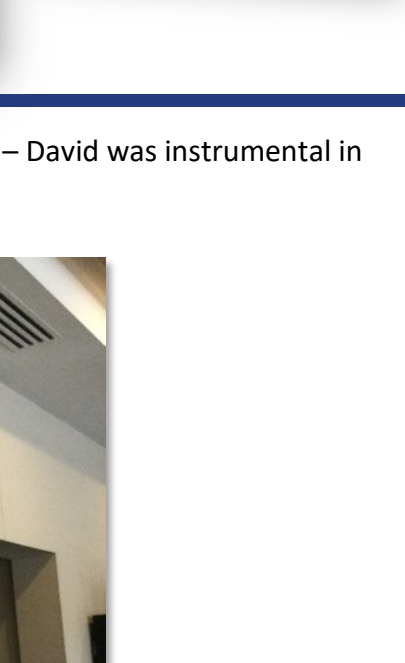
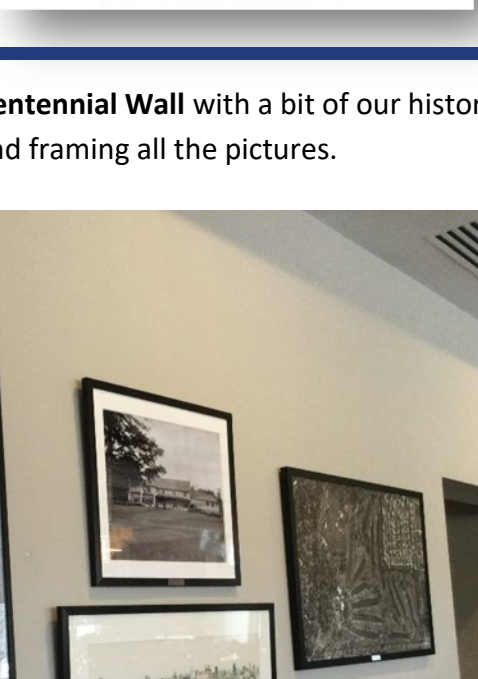
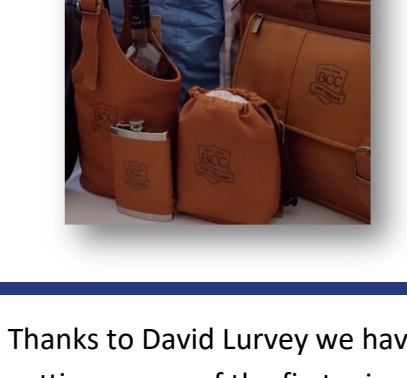
And what a year it has been! 2022 has been a very busy year at Broadmoor, especially for our 100th! We thought we would use our last edition for a full-year recap.

We published our first **Centennial Newsletter** in February, the first of 8 editions:

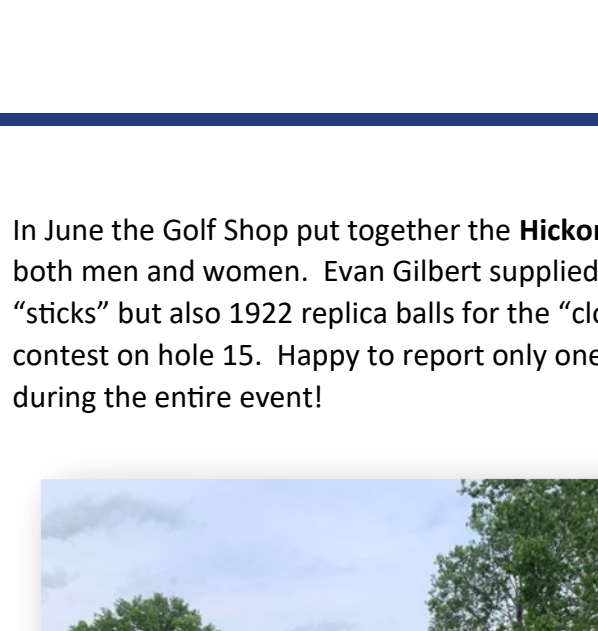
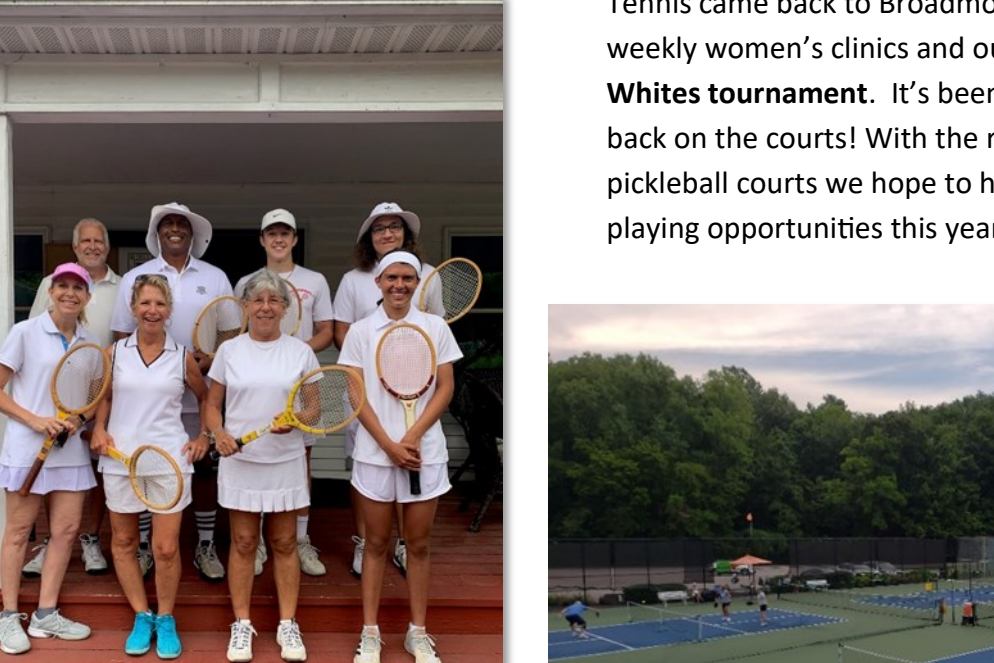

Abby Timmer created our Centennial **logo** and Keith and James stocked the Golf Shop with all kinds of memorable merchandise.



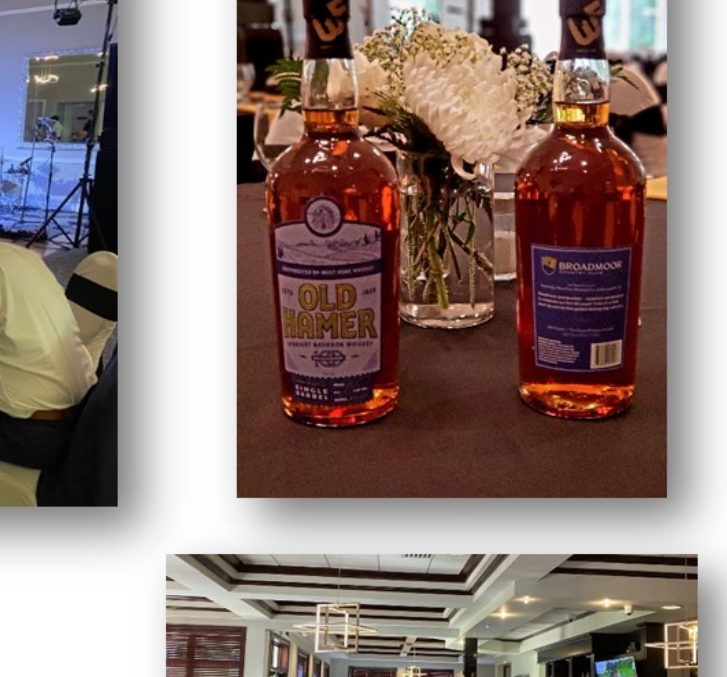
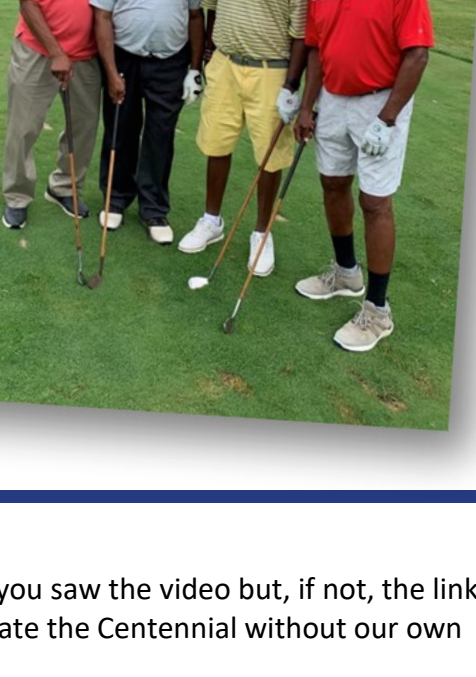
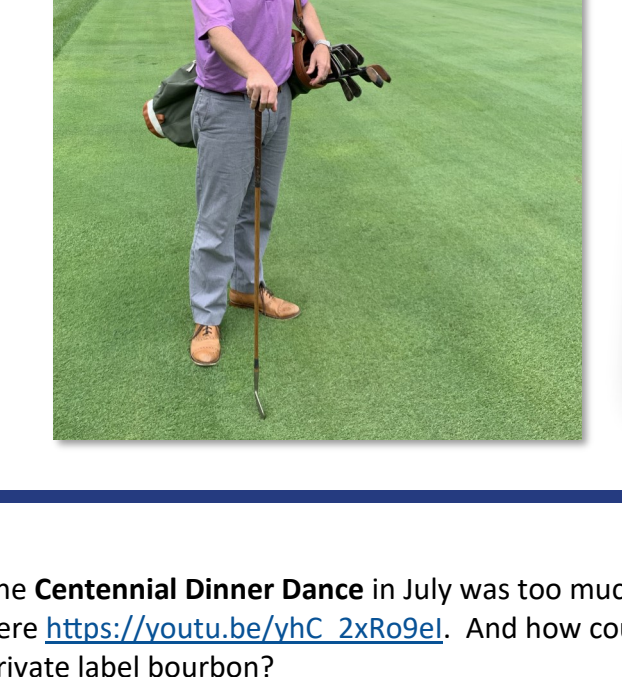
Thanks to David Lurvey we have a **Centennial Wall** with a bit of our history – David was instrumental in getting a copy of the first minutes and framing all the pictures.



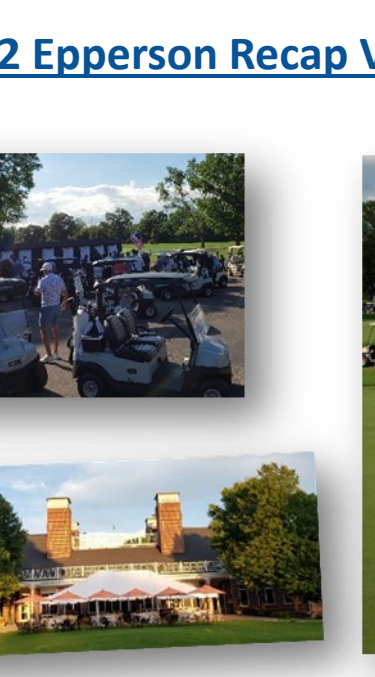

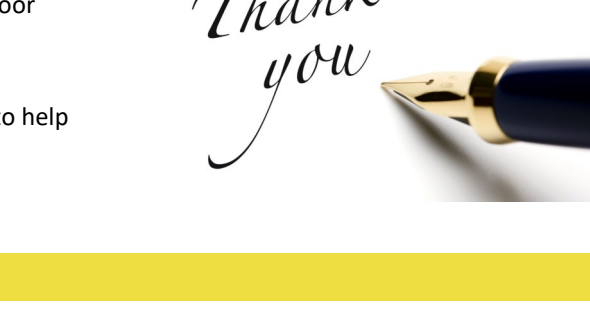
The annual **Border Battle** was held at Broadmoor with the home team **WINNERS**!
