The BCC Foundation: A New Opportunity

Last month we introduced our membership to the recently created BCC Foundation. As you were recently notified, the Broadmoor Board of Directors (thanks to members **Phil Genetos** and **Gina Giacone**) applied for and received approval to establish the **BCC Foundation**. Broadmoor Country Club is already designated as a 501(c)(7) – this IRS designation applies to a social or recreational club that is exempt from federal income tax by the IRS if they are "for pleasure, recreation, and other

nonprofit purposes." That's Broadmoor Country Club.

The **BCC Foundation**, however, a 501(c)(3) entity, allows our members to make tax-deductible contributions to Broadmoor. The Patio Project is a perfect example of this tax-deductible opportunity for members while adding a wonderful amenity to our club. Many of our members contributed to this endeavor and we will be able to start work on this project in early fall.

Championship – again, some of the hottest weather we have had for a bit.




The carts were lined up early on Friday to start practice play.





Grounds Report by Chris Groene

We experienced a nice break in the weather for the first part of August with cooler than average temperatures and minimal rainfall. Compared to a wet, storm filled July, August only had one significant rain event on the 15th and 16th producing over 2" of rain. We continued to pursue fast and firm conditions throughout the month and have seen some increased localized dry spots, primarily in fairways, as a result.



"Dollar spot" appears this time of year – on golf courses and maybe your lawn?

To provide those conditions we pushed and stressed the turf with additional maintenance practices and minimal irrigation through the Club Championship held August 23rd through the 25th. Now that

the championship is complete and hot weather has returned for the end of August we will begin recovery mode with additional irrigation cycles, supplemental nutrition, and wetting agent applications.



As we look ahead into September, we will continue to prioritize maintenance tasks with our smaller maintenance team to provide you with the best golf experience possible. Leaf cleanup will become a top priority, and a good amount of labor hours will need to be shifted to that task. We will also begin to selectively spot aerify our weakest fairway areas with a solid tine which will have little to no impact or disruption to daily play.

We are all looking forward to another great month of golf and hope you can come out to enjoy the course this September! Look for the next Divot Party announcement.




Book Club regulars Larry Dorfman, Vera McAdoo, Jenna Rutherford, Terry Green, and Jan Frazier had a great book club evening!


This is a wonderful book recommended by several folks. Hope you all enjoy it!
