

## Reminder about RSVP's and our Cancellation Policy

Over the last two years we have attached RSVP links to our advertised events. As we continue to keep an eye on operational expenses, including F&B staff and food costs, the RSVP numbers are critical for anticipating both staff schedules and food costs. We appreciate those members who RSVP to our events.

Unfortunately, there are times when members have simply not shown up when plans changed – either theirs or ours.

We know that things happen to get in the way of your plans but we do ask for a courtesy call or email if you will not attend an event to which you have responded. In the event of a no show without cancelling, the member will be charged 50% of the advertised cost
