# Member Spotlight: Meet the Lopez Aguilera Family

In 2008, Vanessa Lopez lived close to the Club, was single, and spent much of her time on boards and other volunteer activities. Her friends and colleagues, Terry Curry and Melina Kennedy, encouraged her to join Broadmoor to expand her horizons!

Born in San Juan, Puerto Rico, Vanessa was an 8-year-old third grader when her mother moved to Indiana to complete a master's degree at IU Bloomington (at first, Vanessa thought she was moving to India!). A little girl with broken English who never saw snow or experienced wintry weather adapted quickly to her new life.

Growing up in Bloomington,

Vanessa went to Bloomington South High School then double-majored in Spanish and Sociology at IU. But after graduation, she began to wonder how she would pay off her student loans with those two majors! Hence, she made the decision to go to law school, applied to and was accepted by several schools, and selected the IU McKinney School of Law in Indianapolis. She was sworn into the bar in 2005.



Vanessa worked for a firm for two years, the first female and minority hired. But she continued to hear the term "Rainmaker" without knowing what that meant – and once she did, she decided to make her own rain. She opened Lopez Law Office PC in 2008 and at this time her firm has grown to include 3 attorneys and 4 paralegals in a building she purchased at 35<sup>th</sup> and Meridian.

She continued to volunteer her time with numerous organizations, including the Eiteljorg Museum, Indiana Latino Expo (of which she was president), La Plaza, and from 2012-2016 was a Trustee of the Marion County Library, appointed by the City-County Council. But she eventually walked away from politics due to the frustrations of working in that world.

John Aguilera comes from a strong steel mill industry background and is a former State Representative from NW Indiana – one of the first Latino representatives. After retiring from that post, he became a lobbyist for the City of East Chicago. Today he oversees the IT program at the J. Everett Light Career Center. John and Vanessa first met in 2007 through politics and married in 2013. For their 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary they came to eat at Broadmoor!

Daughter Magdalena was born in 2011 and has attended the International School since she was 3. Vanessa started taking her to the pool at the age of 4 months, and was the youngest



child to ever jump off the diving board – at the age of 2! In addition to volleyball, crochet and knitting, you will see Magdalina in the dining room while Mom is at Book Club, Golf, or other activity.

Having worked so hard for so long, Vanessa decided she wanted time to do things for her. Tired of reading law books, she jumped into the Broadmoor Book Club and, from that, met other members who encouraged her to join our Ladies Golf League and Adult Pickleball evenings. So, every Tuesday you will see her on the golf course, Thursdays at pickleball, every month at Book Club, and frequently at the pool.


Because of the change in dates, we had fewer numbers than last year but 24 ladies played all 18 holes.

# **Grounds Report by Chris Groene**

Storm events continued to be a challenge in August, especially on August 8th when our daily rain total reached 3.2", a daily record since I started here in 2010. We also had a storm event on August 13th that totaled another 1.4". In total for August, we received 6.2" which is above average for the month; however, we have not had any rainfall since August 16th.

The heavy rains cause soil to become extremely saturated and limit the amount of oxygen available to the roots causing turf stress and eventually turf loss, especially in low lying swales and drainage areas. These areas become even more stressed as it dries out and high temperatures return as we saw in late August.

Fortunately, as we get into September, nighttime temperatures are typically much cooler which helps aide in the recovery of those areas. While always trying to balance firm and fast playing conditions, we will also be providing supplemental irrigation at night to minimize any future turf loss and help recover any stressed areas. Cart traffic adds significant stress, especially in fairways, so please be considerate to the turf when using carts. Sharp turns, hard stops and starts, and repeated traffic in stressed areas all lead to turf decline. Please continue to follow the GPS guidelines on the cart and use the paths around greens and tees to help protect the turf. Please continue to replace your divots, especially important this time of year as we will get good recovery, and keep fixing those ball marks!

# **Racquet Sports**

September is when players begin to return to indoor courts. While our clinics are over for the summer, you are welcome to come and play anytime the weather permits. Let Rob Greathouse know if you want to reserve any courts; he also has access to the tennis house for extra paddles and balls for pickleball.

**Amy Sermersheim** and **Danielle Mancewicz** have volunteered to be our tennis leads for next summer and, in the meantime, have scheduled <u>Friday, September 15<sup>th</sup></u> for our next open tennis night. We are already looking at next summer and hope to schedule more pay-as-you-play clinics. Many of our members have asked for an evening clinic so we will be working on that.

Our <u>Broadmoor Adult Pickleball</u> sessions went great for our first year, but we know that it was difficult for some members to commit to an entire session with various work and travel schedules. We will have a pay-as-you-play option for pickleball next year as well.




# **Euchre and Game Nights**

# **Book Club Updates**






