# Grounds Report by Chris Groene

September was a very busy month for the grounds crew, especially considering everything was accomplished with a 40% reduction in labor hours due to our seasonal staff returning to school in August. Despite the reduction, we continued to prepare the golf course to our high standards during a very busy golf schedule.

We continue to adjust our priorities and maintenance tasks on a daily basis in order to provide the best possible conditions, with conditions



reaching their best during tournaments such as The Mordoh Cup, The Fall Starter Scramble, and the Ulndy Invitational. Looking ahead into October, course preparation will remain a high priority through the first half of the month so plan to come out and enjoy a few more rounds of golf. Leaves will start to become a nuisance to playability, and we will do our best to clear leaves as efficiently as possible and mulch the leaf piles/rows into the rough.

Be sure to mark your calendars for **Thursday**, **October 19** as that is our scheduled greens aerification, weather dependent. The golf course will be completely closed that day. We will reopen greens on Friday, October 20, but expectations for putting greens quality should be low following this process. This is a vital process to promote better, deeper rooting that gives us the ability to provide fantastic putting surfaces during the season. Weather dependent, the following week on October 23 and 24 the course will be limited to play for fairway and tee aerification. I appreciate your understanding during aerification, and we will work as quickly as possible to recover.

**DIY TIP**: If you have not already, early October is still a good time to aerify your lawn and overseed. Using solid tines (only punching a solid hole) have shown to be just as effective at promoting rooting versus coring tines (removes and leaves the soil core on the surface) and solid tines leave no mess that needs to be cleaned up. Bluegrass/Ryegrass seed combinations are typically used in Indiana lawns, but you may also consider using "Turf Type Tall Fescue" especially if your yard is not irrigated as Tall Fescue is much more drought tolerant than Bluegrass or Ryegrass.
