New Cart Fleet Providing Comfort and Course Protection

By now many have seen and experienced the comfortable ride of the all new ClubCar Fleet. When the new fleet was purchased, we took added measures to select a battery system with greater longevity, less weight and the latest in technology for a golf cart fleet.



The technology that is noticeable right away is the GPS Geofencing technology. As a player, through GPS you now experience the "to the pin" measurement and the geofencing. Golf course conditions and playing conditions at

Broadmoor are at the top of our priorities. We continue to invest in staffing and equipment along with other resources to create and protect our renowned conditions.

The geofencing system allows us to create parameters to direct and help ensure crucial areas are protected from the matting, turf tear and severe rutting in wet areas created by cart traffic. When setting up the system, the goal was to protect the playing areas around the green and bunker complexes and protect the areas around the tees. As you ride in the carts you should hear and see color coded notifications when approaching a protected area.

An area in **orange** is a warning zone asking players to avoid a protected area. An area in **red** notifies you of a restricted area. If the cart does continue towards the restricted area, the system is programmed to stop the cart. If you have reached a point where the cart has been stopped, the system will allow you reverse out of the zoned area.



Grounds and Greens by Chris Groene

May has been a very busy month for the grounds crew. As is typical in May, the turf, especially our roughs, grow extremely fast and produce a lot of seed head stalks that make playing from the rough much more difficult. Although it may not have looked like it at times, the roughs are mowed an extra time or two a week to try to stay on top of the extra growth.

During May we also finished the #18 tee irrigation expansion project, continued to grow in the old construction sites and performed the first mowing in those areas; laid 10,800 square

feet along the old haul road that crossed #10, #14, and #13 tees; and began work on cart paths. The course really started to shape up this month into fast and firm tournament conditions with daily green speeds averaging 11'-12'.

As we look ahead to June, we are already making preparation plans for the Noel Epperson Member/Guest so we can really showcase the club. Over the next few weeks, we plan to till, seed, and straw most of the remaining haul road/construction areas. We will also be going through cart paths to level, add material as needed, and roll. We hope to have any remaining stumps ground and leveled as well. On top of those special projects, we will also be focusing on extra detail work and continuing to provide the best playing conditions throughout central Indiana.

DIY TIP of the Month

If you haven't applied a preemergent herbicide application to your lawn for crabgrass prevention it's not too late, but be sure to use a product that contains Dimension. Dimension provides some control on young crabgrass plants that have already germinated. We are getting late in the application window so it will be important to get this product out early June. After mid-June we are typically past the window for preemergent products, and you will need to begin postemergent applications to control any crabgrass breakthrough.
