Members now have online access to club announcements, an up-to-date event calendar, dining menus and hours, club rules, the Honours Reciprocal Club Directory, and a member directory.


To access the exclusive member content go to cherokeeridgegolf.com and click on the "Member's Area" tab. You will then be directed to enter your member name and password. Your

member name is a four-digit member number that was assigned to you when you joined Cherokee Ridge. Don't remember your number? It is also the last four digits of the member number listed on your monthly billing statement.

Next, enter your last name in lowercase letters as your password. Then press the "Submit" button.

Once logged in, you will see the announcement page with the heading "Welcome, Cherokee Ridge Members!"

A menu on the right offers a variety of information for members to read.



At this point, we encourage members to visit the "Update Profile" option near the bottom of the menu.

This page allows members to update their password from their last name to something more private. It also allows members to select the information they would like to share in the private member directory. Honours Golf only provides member names. It is each member's choice whether

to share their contact information in this private directory. Members may share their address, two phone numbers, a fax number, and several e-mail addresses (separated by commas).

Please note that updating your member profile does not update your contact information in the Cherokee Ridge office. Please contact the club office if you need to change your contact information or if you would like assistance with the member portal.

HONOURS GOLF WELCOMES NEW SUPERINTENDENT

Golf Course Superintendent Dan Sexton joined Cherokee Ridge on May 6. Having spent his entire career managing bentgrass in the South, he looks forward to bringing his skills and knowledge to Alabama.

Sexton earned a bachelor's degree in Turf Management from the University of Arkansas. While a student, he interned at Southern Hills Country Club in Tulsa, Oklahoma. During his internship, Southern Hills hosted the 2001 U.S. Open, giving him the experience of preparing a golf course at championship conditions.

Following graduation, Sexton was hired as the assistant superintendent at Pinnacle Country Club in Rogers, Arkansas, where he worked from 2003 to 2008. Pinnacle Country Club hosts the annual LPGA Northwest Arkansas Championship.

More recently, Sexton has been the golf course superintendent at Rarity Bay Golf and Country Club in Vonore, Tennessee. Sexton spent the past five years at Rarity Bay, where he and his staff worked hard to restore the bentgrass putting surfaces and maintain them to a high standard. Through hard work, sound agronomic practices, and attention to detail, they were able to maintain the greens at a high level through some challenging seasons.

spring and began airing them in April. In order to target local golfers, the television commercials currently air only during golf tournaments on CBS and NBC.



The renovations were completed in plenty of time for summer fun! The pool is tentatively scheduled to open on Memorial weekend.


ALEX OLIVER: AGE IS ONLY A NUMBER




