WHERE TO DROP THE BALL — FROM GOLF DIGEST DEC 2013

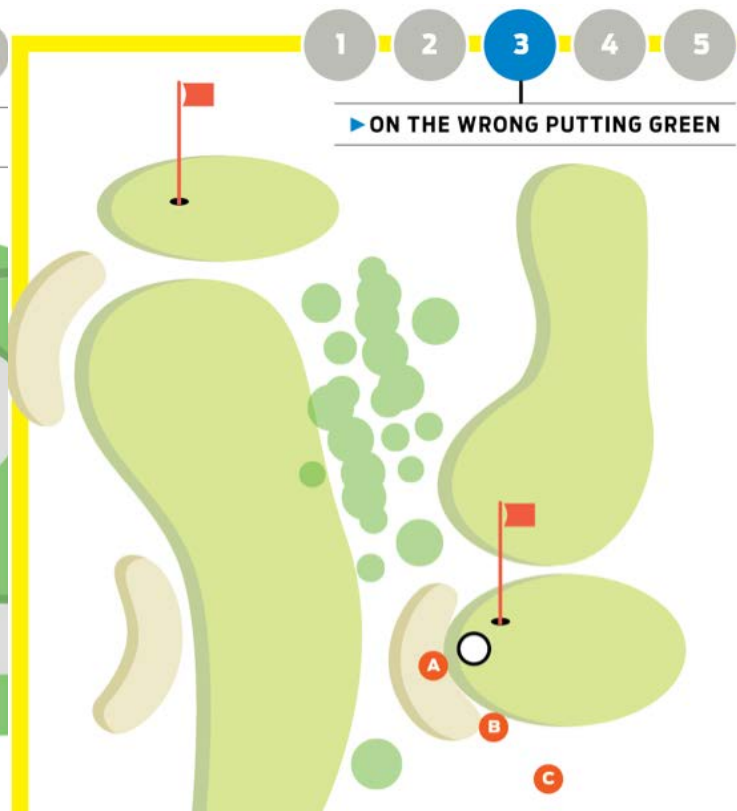
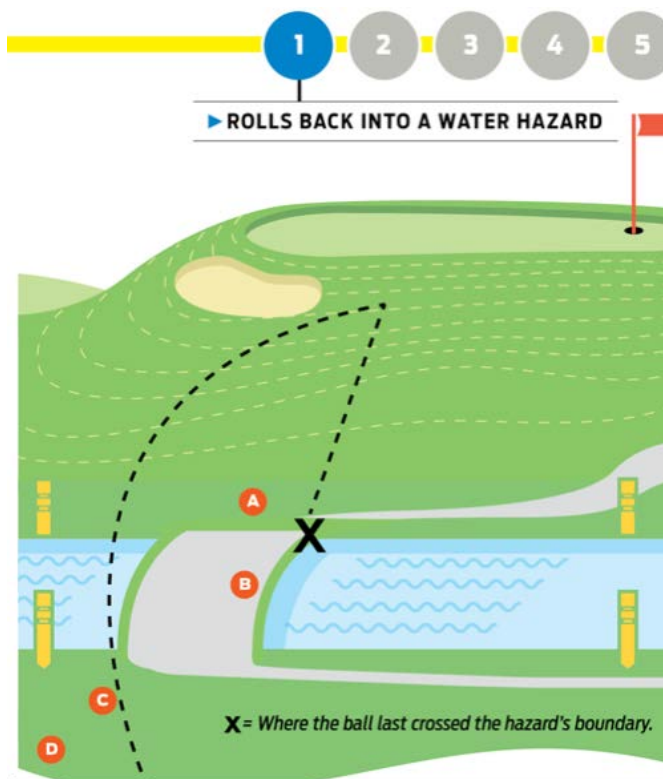
Take Golf Digest's Year End Quiz

Your Options Might Surprise You!

Take a look at the illustrations we found in December's issue of Golf Digest. This gives us pictures of the options you have when you choose to drop the ball. The answers are on the bottom of the next page.

Note each situation is numbered. The corresponding answer are below. They explain each of the options and let you know which ones are legal and which are not.

Read through these as Heron Lakes Golf Course offers us the opportunity to be in each of these situations. It will speed play if we have a clear understanding of the rules for dropping balls and can quickly apply the rule and hit the shot we intended the first time.





ANSWER KEY 1 C, D. Water hazards, marked with yellow stakes or lines, don't allow for a lateral drop within two club-lengths of where the ball last entered the hazard, which eliminates **A**. Option **B** is not allowed, because you can't drop in a hazard. (The bridge is considered part of the hazard.) But notice that if you drew a line from the hole, through the point where the ball entered the hazard, and continued the line away from the hole, **C** and **D** are OK because they fall on that line and are outside the hazard's boundary. **2 A.** That spot is the nearest point for a right-handed golfer to stand and swing without interference from the path and is no closer to the hole. Left-handers would likely have to drop on the other side of the path. **3 B.** When your ball is on the wrong green, drop within one club-length of the nearest point of relief that's not in a hazard (option **A** is

in a bunker) or on a green. Option **B**, not **C**, is the nearest point. **4 B, C.** Option **B** is OK because it's within two club-lengths of the ball and no closer to the hole. You can't drop closer to the hole than the ball's location, eliminating **A**. Option **C** is OK because it's on an imaginary line with the hole and ball, and is no closer to the hole than the ball's current location. **5 A, B, C.** Option **A** is OK, because it's within two club-lengths of where the ball last entered the lateral water hazard (marked with red stakes or lines), is outside the hazard's boundary, and is no closer to the hole. Option **B** is OK because it's on a line that starts at the hole, goes through the spot where the ball last entered the hazard and continues away from the hole. Option **C** is OK, because it's at a point on the opposite margin of the lateral hazard from where the ball last entered it and is equidistant from the hole, unlike **D**.
