..... Cleaning a Ball

Q1: When taking relief from an immovable obstruction a player may not clean his ball. True or False?

Q2: A player is permitted to remove a leaf adhering to their ball through the green, providing they do not touch or move the ball. True or False?



Q3: In which of the following circumstances is a player permitted to clean their ball when they lift it within the Rules?

- a) To determine if it is unfit for play.
- b) When it is embedded in a closely mown area.
- c) To identify it.
- d) When it is interfering with play.

Q4: In stroke play, a player who cleans their ball when the Rules do not permit incurs the general penalty of two strokes. True or False?

Q5: A player is not permitted to clean a ball by applying a foreign material to it. True or False?

Q6: A ball that is lifted under the Rules may only be cleaned by the player or their caddie. True or False?

Q7: Rule 12 -2 states that a ball that is lifted for identification may be cleaned. True or False?

Q8: When replacing a ball that has been lifted for identification, the player tees it on a piece of mud adhering to their ball and makes their stroke. What is the ruling?



- a) No penalty was incurred.
- b) A penalty of one stroke was incurred.
- c) A penalty of two strokes was incurred

Q9: A player is asked to lift their ball because it is interfering with the stance of a fellow competitor. They pick-up their ball and throw it to their caddie who catches it. This act incurs a penalty for cleaning the ball. True, False, or Maybe?

A1: False. Rule 24-2. A2: False. Anything adhering to a ball is not a loose impediment, as per the Definition.: b) When it is embedded in a closely mown area. Rule 25-2. A4: False. The penalty is one stroke. Rule 21.A5: False, providing the foreign material has not been applied to the ball for the purpose of changing its playing characteristics. Rule 5-3.A6: False. There is no restriction in the Rules as to who cleans the ball. A7: False. Rule 12-2 states that a ball must not be cleaned beyond the extent necessary for identification. A8: c) A penalty of two strokes was incurred. Decision 21/5 and Rule 20-3a. A9: Maybe. Whether the ball is cleaned as a result of this action is a question of fact. Any doubt should be resolved against the player. Decision 21/3.
