## Men's Club 9-Hole, One Club Challenge & Sanding Party

Wednesday, August 3rd

At 4:00 pm on August 3rd, the Men's Club will have their usual 9-Hole Competition, but they are going to do a One Club Challenge (can only use one club) and give the Men's Club participants a sand bottle to fill divots along the way. They will then continue onto the back 9 around 6:15pm (hopefully picking up some additional volunteers from the Ladies Club) with the aim of sanding/seeding divots in fairways for all 18 holes.

### Itinerary 8/3: Men's Club 9-Hole 1 Club Challenge & Sanding Party

- 3:45 pm Men's Club members meet on Range/1st Tee with 25+ Sand bottles and one Gator full of sand/seed.
- 4:00 pm Men's Club competition tee off in one or two large groups, dependent on numbers.
- 6:15 pm Those able to make the turn will continue onto the back 9 for sanding only, and we'll link up with any other volunteers who wish to participate. The plan is to have another Gator full of sand/seed ready to go on the back.

It usually takes about 1.5 hours to sand/seed the divots for 9 holes assuming a decent number of volunteers. Sanding parties are fun—we have music going and some beverages flowing. Sanding/seeding divots obviously benefits all golfers as it helps improve course conditions, so hopefully this experiment with integrating sanding with a competition works out well.
