Sudden Valley Golf Club Turfcare Update

Since my last update, much has happened with course conditions in a positive way. As it stands, impressive results of seed germination have occurred on all our putting greens. With longer days and warmer temperatures soon to be upon us much of the thin perimeter areas of our greens will fill in.

So, what is happening on the course moving forward:

- Back 9 fairway slicing completed and planning to complete the front 9 within the week. This process is done into the clay layer and assists with drainage.
- Close up chipping green and overseed area that we "borrowed" sod from.
- Top up all sand traps with fresh sand.
- Cart path repair work is scheduled for the second week in June. Please be aware of contractors working on the golf course.
- We continue to lightly and frequently top dress the greens with sand to aid in filling and smoothing our putting surfaces. This will gradually slow to a two-week interval instead of the weekly applications currently being applied.
- All our new gold tee boxes are now open.
- There are more trees on the course that need attention and we will be addressing them as we move forward.

Thank you for your understanding and patience as we roll into what is shaping up to be an exciting, dry, and warm 2024 golf season!

- Par 3s played as gross in Net game (no strokes applied or subtracted regardless of handicap)
- Max 1 handicap stroke per hole in Net game (no double pops regardless of handicap)

- Men's Club Captain reserves the right to apply adjusted handicaps to net players who consistently shoot below net par, or do not have recent scores posted

Club Championship Match Play Brackets

- Brackets will continue to be seeded by handicap (no qualifying round required)
- An email was sent out to all Men's Club Members in late May with a list of those registered to ensure that no one who wishes to participate is accidentally left out
- Brackets finalized by June 1st. Once the brackets are finalized/posted, no late registrations will be permitted
- Please complete your matches in a timely manner so the Men's Captain doesn't need to chase people down. Men's Captain has full discretion to disqualify golfer(s) who don't schedule and complete their matches within the stated date windows.

Men's Invitational

- Biggest and best Men's Club event of the season. You do not want to miss this tournament!
- As a part of the multi-year transition back to a true member-guest, full members will no longer be allowed to form a team with each other. Full Members (defined as any membership option that provides unlimited golf) will still be allowed to register with Associate or Social members

Do you know? Rules & Etiquette

GHIN Index vs. your Course Handicap based on the tees you play.

There still seems to be some confusion between what GHIN lists as your handicap index and what your Sudden Valley daily course handicap will be for the tees you are playing.

Handicap index and daily course handicap are not the same despite the terms often being used interchangeably. However, they work together to measure you against other golfers and any course you're playing.

But what's the difference between index and handicap? One noticeable difference is your handicap index usually has a decimal while your daily course handicap will be a whole number.

Your index is a number determined by recent scores and identifies how skilled a player you are. To get your handicap index, the GHIN system keeps track of your 20 most recent scores. Then, your worst 12 are thrown away and the remaining 8 are averaged out. The average of your best 8 becomes your handicap index and ultimately, this number is used to calculate daily course handicap.

A handicap takes your index and applies it against the course (and tee markers) to predict how many strokes over (or under) par you will shoot. You cannot determine your handicap without first knowing your index.

Fortunately, the GHIN website will calculate your handicap for you. After you have logged into the GHIN app go to the Handicap Calculator tool, you just select the course and which tees you're playing (gold, silver, green, etc.) and the app will do the calculation for you.

The Pro Shop also has printed out conversion charts as well and can tell players what their course handicap is from the tee they plan to play.

Hopefully this helps with any confusion.
