The Men's invite continues to grow and was amazingly successful. Congratulations guys for another great event. The Women's invite was fun as ever and raised \$1,300 that was donated to the Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Services. Kudos to you ladies who played and contributed.

This year was the first year for the Spring Two-Person Scramble to raise money for the Bellingham Food Bank. Almost \$3,000 was raised to fight hunger and food insecurity. Those who played and gave helped individuals and families not only across the county but also right here in our Valley.

I want to give a shout out to all the golf board members who work to make this club a success. I especially would like to thank Lorna Lane. Sadly, Lorna is stepping down from the club secretary position. She has dedicated much of her time keeping me in line and reminding me of things I need to do. She takes extremely accurate meeting notes, and she is responsible for the success of our club newsletter. In addition, she organizes the Tuesday/Thursday Ladies golf groups. Thank you, Lorna, for all you have done for the club.

With all that is good with our golf club, I am concerned about the decline in our membership numbers. In 2022 and 2023 the total membership was static with 590 total members. This year, 2024, the total membership declined to 545 with the largest decline from the previous year in couples' memberships (27% decrease), Family memberships (55% decrease) and junior memberships (48% decrease). This next year I hope to work with Kevin and Darren to find ways to appeal to golfers in our region and highlight the benefits of being a Sudden Valley Golf Club Member. We have the best course in the area and a great club. Sustainability will depend on encouraging others to join. Our club will be healthier, the pro shop and golf course will be busier, and our Sudden Valley Community will benefit if we can successfully grow the golf club.

Having said that, you, the members, have made this a great place to live and play golf. Thank you all for your support.

Do You Know?

Good Golf Etiquette

The following in an excerpt from an article written by Arnold Palmer many years ago and it still applies to today's game.

Don't be the slowest player

Encourage everyone to move quickly enough so you find yourself right behind the group in front several times, both early and late in the round.

Play "ready golf" (hit when ready, even if you aren't away) until you reach the green, be prepared to play when it's your turn on the tee and green, and never search for a lost ball for more than five minutes.

Repair the ground you play on

Fix your ball marks. Replace divots or use the sand/seed mix to fill your divot. Rake bunkers like you mean it. Ever notice that the worse the bunker shot, the poorer the job the player does raking the sand? Make the area nice and smooth - don't leave deep furrows from the rake. Before you exit the bunker, ask yourself, *Would I be upset if I had to play from that spot*?

Be a silent partner

Be still from the time a player sets himself until the ball has left the club. Also, never walk in someone's line of play on the putting green. The area around the hole in particular is sacred ground. The first thing to note when you walk onto a green is the location of every ball in your group, then steer clear of their lines to the hole.

Know where to stand and when to keep quiet. Position yourself directly across or at a diagonal from a player setting up. Never stand on the line of play, either beyond the hole or directly behind the ball. When a player is about to hit a shot, think of the fairway as a cathedral, the green a library.

Turn off your cell phone

Do whatever you have to do to keep your cell phone quiet. And if you absolutely have to make a call, move away from the other players. And keep the call so brief that they don't even know you made it.

Learn the little things

Like laying the flagstick down carefully, tamping down spike marks when you're walking off a green, letting faster groups play through, and so on. All of these things are learned by observing, with a sharp eye and a considerate heart. Just know that golf has a way of returning favors, and every piece of etiquette you practice will be repaid tenfold.
