Do You Know? Rules and Etiquette

Rule 16.1c – Abnormal Course Condition in a Bunker (e.g., temporary water)

If your ball is in a bunker and there's casual water (temporary water):

- 1. Free Relief (still in the bunker):
 - You may take relief without penalty by dropping your ball within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief, no nearer the hole.
 - The drop must stay inside the bunker.
- 2. Relief Outside the Bunker (penalty option):
 - o If there's no reasonable relief inside the bunker, you may take the ball **outside the bunker**, keeping the point where the ball lies directly between the hole and the spot where you drop.
 - This comes with a one-stroke penalty.

So, in short:

Free relief inside the bunker.

Or, for one penalty stroke, you can drop outside the bunker.


Last Day to Post Scores

In Washington State, you stop posting scores at the beginning of the Inactive Score Posting Season on November 15th and resume posting scores on March 1st. During the winter months, from November 15th to March 1st, Washington Golf observes this inactive season, as course conditions are generally different from the midseason conditions used to rate the courses.
