PROGRAM LEVELS

Renaissance Jr. Golf offers three (3) levels of program activity. These levels are:

Level I Beginner
Level II Pitch and Putt

Level III Regulation Golf Course and Local Tournaments

All levels will receive golf skill clinics, conducted by PGA professional (s) Each level has required skills for which proficiencies must be demonstrated, as well as scores that must be achieved in Levels II and above in order to qualify to participate at the higher levels. These proficiencies and scores will be covered at our Registration.

SPRING PROGRAM

Programs include a golf Clinics that teaches golf swing fundamentals, the rules of the game, safety and golf course etiquette.

Renaissance Jr. Golf will make every reasonable effort to exclude any adult with a legally documented history of child abuse/molestation or any other record that would bring unnecessary risk to the health and safety of the participants of this organization. Therefore, every person applying for a position as a coach/trainer must complete a Renaissance Jr. Golf, Inc. Employee Disclosure Statement (see attached).

Renaissance Jr. Golf, Inc. will take appropriate action on all allegations of child abuse and/or sexual misconduct. All allegations will be reported immediately to the authorities for investigation and Renaissance Jr. Golf, Inc. will cooperate fully with any such investigation.

The following is a list of preventive measures which should be taken:

- Physical, mental, and verbal abuses are forbidden.
- Inappropriate touching is forbidden.
- Coaches/trainers should not ride solo with a child.
- Parents are encouraged to attend sponsored activities.
- If a child needs special attention (one on one), do it with the assistance of another adult.

So if you can, join our family. Volunteer. Help with car pooling. Help with the newsletter. Help at Pitch and Putt by going out with a group and recording scores. Make mailing labels. Volunteer to keep the roster up to date. Volunteer to be a phone captain. We'll teach you how if you don't know. Help with wherever you can, however you can. You can help make a difference, if to borrow a phrase from an ad, you "just do it!". Find a way to help that you enjoy and is affirming, and just do it"!

♦ Frequently Asked Questions ("FAQ")

One of the most frequently asked questions is: "What is my role as a parent whose child is participating in Renaissance?" Our answer is: "To understand, support, and help achieve the goals of the Renaissance Jr. Golf program." Those goals are to:

- Provide a multi-faced golf program for inner city and minority youth.
- Provide instruction on golf swing fundamentals, pitching, chipping, and putting.
- Teach the rules, safety, and etiquette of the game of golf.
- Provide an opportunity for participants to play golf for enjoyment and recreation.
- Provide an opportunity for competitive development.

Do's For Parents

Make sure your Renaissance Jr. Golfer:

- Is **dressed appropriately** for the day's activities. Shirts with collars should be worn.
- **Arrives on time** for practice and for tournaments.
- Is picked up by you promptly at the end of the practice period or at the conclusion of tournament play.

♦ Important Aspects of the Game of Golf: Etiquette

Etiquette is one of the important aspects of the game of golf. Parents can assist by insuring they understand the rules of etiquette and that their junior golfer practices golf etiquette. Here are eleven of those rules as presented by Earl Woods, the father of Tiger Woods, in his book Training A Tiger:

- Stand still and remain quiet while another player is executing a shot.
- Always be ready to hit when it's your turn.
- Always yell "Fore!" if your shot potentially endangers others.
- If you hear "Fore!" cover your head; don't run.
- Keep all equipment off the green.
- Never run on the putting green.

- When all players are finished on the green, replace the flagstick carefully to avoid damage to the edges of the cup.
- Leave the green immediately, and mark your score later.
- Never throw a club.
- Congratulate playing companions on a shot well executed. Be a good sport and enjoy the game.
- Always shake the hand of your opponent or playing companion at the end of a round of golf.
