Greens Aerification has been completed and they are healing in quickly. I anticipate that we will be at our normal height of cut by this weekend. One of the most important things you can do as a golfer is to repair your ball marks. Repairing your ball mark insures the playing surfaces remains as smooth as possible along with giving the grass a chance to heal properly. This year we had significant damage occur to our fairways due to a combination of things, thatch and poa not being able to handle the heat. This fall we will be solid tining our fairways to help promote recovery. We will then follow this next year with two core aerifications, once in the spring and again in the fall. Pulling a core will help reduce the amount of thatch that has accumulated over the years. This will not be a cure all in just one year. However, we will continue to core aerify fairways until the thatch is at a reasonable level which will insure a playing surface that will stand up in all weather. Some of our fairways 5, 8, 9, 12 and 13 have fairly little thatch in them and will not be cored. Thatch is necessary to help protect the turf from cart traffic. This couldn't be more evident than on 9 and 12 fairways where the entrance and exits points could not handle the stress from all the cart traffic and the reason why we will not be core aerifying these fairways.
