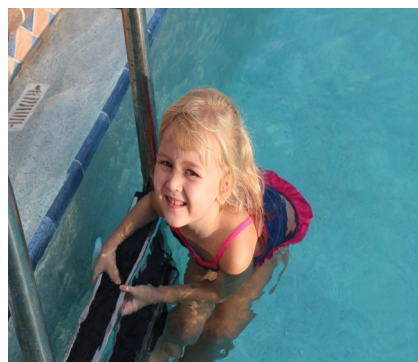

**Need Extra Short Term Parking?**

During the July 16<sup>th</sup> Board of Directors meeting, the board approved the use of a portion of the Recreation Center parking lot for short term passenger vehicle parking ( 1 to 5 days). To use this privilege, contact the Property Manager at the Stoneybrook Recreation Center. The Property Manager is authorized to approve at his or her discretion parking pass requests for a defined period and will issue a pass detailing the time period. The vehicle owner must display the parking pass in the vehicle's front window and sign a waiver of liability. Remember, there is no overnight street parking allowed in Stoneybrook. This policy is intended to assist owners with overnight or short term guests, giving them a place to park other than on the street or blocking the sidewalks.

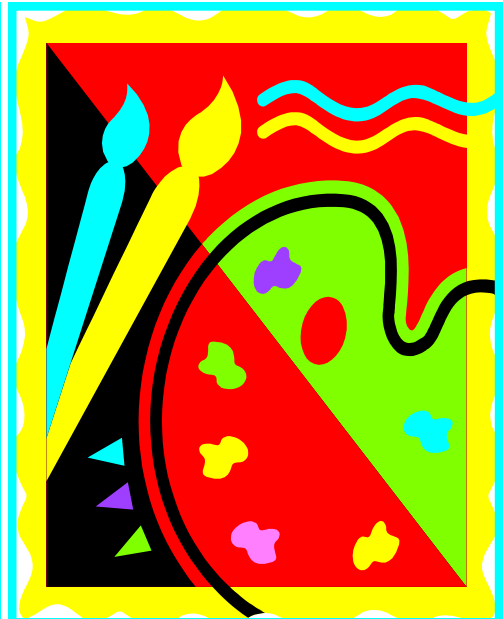


## ATTENTION ALL ARTISTS:

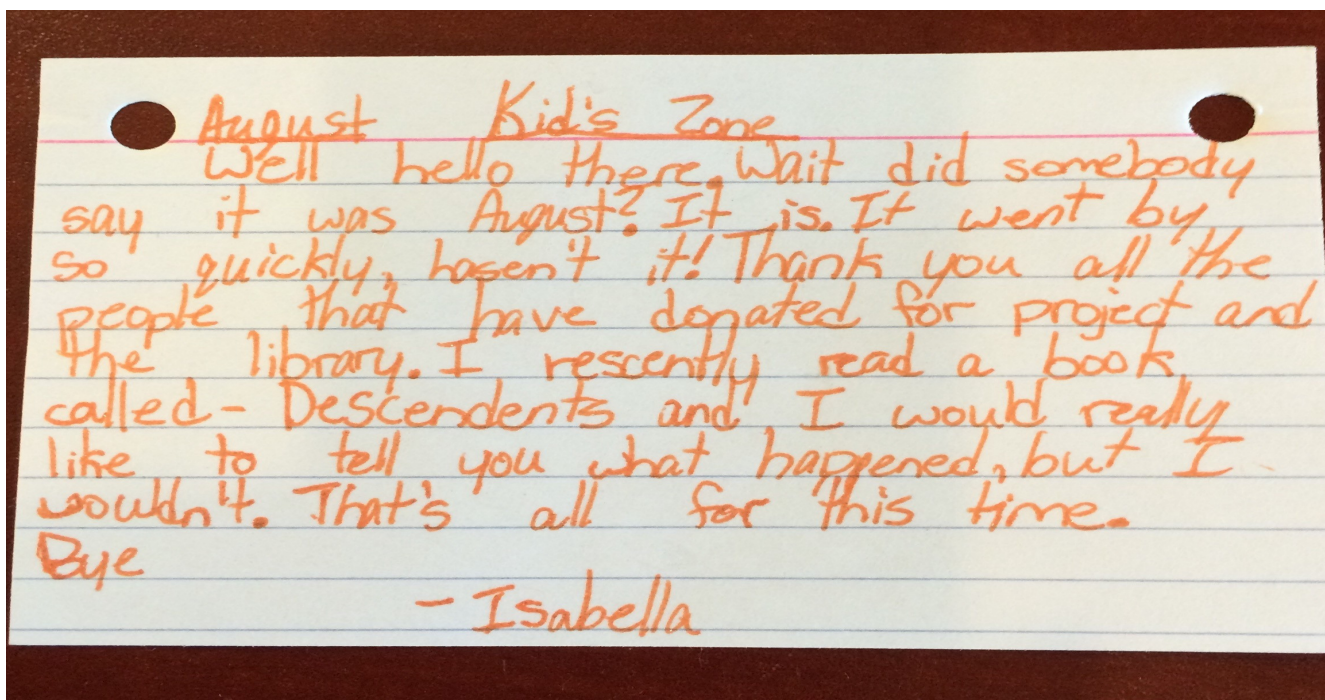

# RAIN AND THE WETLANDS

How well will our storm water system handle the increase in what might become one of the wettest summer seasons in the area? The last time a major clearing was done was several years ago by the previous management and engineering company.



So far, this spring has been the warmest on record at Sarasota- Bradenton airport, with an average temperature of 75.2 degrees, 3.8 degrees above normal. We also have had the earliest start of the summer rainy season with 13 days of rain in May and a rainfall of 6.33 inches. The rain and temperatures are still way above normal. This July has been the hottest ever recorded for our area. (N.O.A.A.) Most of this is due to El Nino. It might also be one of the longest rainy seasons on record, possibly lasting into the spring of 2016. El Nino produces a low pressure in the Pacific, allowing warm moist air to flow eastward into the Gulf of Mexico. This causes unstable air masses to pass lower across the Gulf of Mexico, forcing air patterns to form south west wind patterns to hit the Florida's west coast instead of going upward into the mid-gulf region. This can result in an increase in rainfall of approximately 40% above normal. (E.N.S.O. data base)

Let's take a brief survey of our community. There are forty-two storm water ponds created throughout our community to prevent widespread damage. These are man-made and should not be confused with natural wetlands or wet prairies. Their purpose is to lower flood levels, protect water quality, recharge water supplies, provide a natural cooling system, provide water storage areas for dry periods, create and enhance wildlife habitat and provide aesthetically attractive environments throughout the community. Most of the Stoneybrook property ranges in elevation from a low of 8'6" near the NW corner to a high of 18'4" at the SW corner by S.R. 64.

Are we in a flood zone? No, we are just south of the official flood zone. If we were to put boundaries on the flood area we would see that basically Port Harbour Parkway would be the dividing line. However, its west end, at the junction of Kay Rd. is in an outwash area. Just south of Grand Harbour Parkway at S.R. 64 extending to I 75 is another outwash area.

Two major areas to watch in our community would be both the central and eastern ditches that collect water to eventually flow northward into the Manatee River. The central ditch follows the power lines and is maintained by the Master Association. The eastern ditch is smaller and is found east of Stone Harbour Loop behind the homes and retention ponds, and a wetland area touching Stone Harbour Loop at the junction with Beacon Manor Terrace and east of Willowbrook Circle. The Stoneybrook C.D.D. is responsible for keeping the west side of the ditch clear. The east side of the ditch is the responsibility of The Board of Education, Greenfield Plantation and Medallion Homes. (All three have done nothing to clear out the over growth.) The storm water system must absorb an 8" rain in a one hour period. This includes the street, curbs, their drains, lakes, both littorals and retention ponds, all wetland types and ditches. Overall the system is functioning well enough to allow the passage of water now. However there are areas that are overgrown or contain sediment that are causing a slowdown in water passage. These areas need to be cleared in order for the system to function at an optimal level.

The budget committee is in the final stages of preparing the first draft of our 2016 operating and reserve accounts. Board presentations will start in September. We also have a group working on a 5 year capital plan as well as revisions to our mission and vision statements.

Speaking of revisions, an updated Homeowners Manual (8/5/15) is available with all the latest info for both new and current residents. This is of course a "living document" and changes will occur as time and conditions require. You can find it on the website or ask at the office for a copy.

With school back in session, please be extra careful driving around the community, especially in the morning and late afternoon hours. When you are out on Port Harbour Pkwy watch for the school buses too.

As I write this Hurricane Danny is forming off the Atlantic coast. When was the last time you checked your storm shutters? Do you and your family have a plan in place for what you will do in the event a storm hits the Bradenton area? Water, batteries, flashlight, important documents secured? Maybe a family conversation around the dinner table would help. Don't forget to secure loose patio furniture. Our Management Company, ICON has prepared a Guide and copies are on the website and in the office.

By the way, do we have your correct email address? A great deal of information is sent out to residents and tenants electronically. If you have recently changed it, please send an email to the office with the updated info. Also, don't forget to get that golf cart registration info to us as well.

And finally, last month your Board approved a policy change on parking. With prior approval and a pass from the Office, limited guest parking is available at the Rec Center, overnight for passenger vehicles. No trucks, boats or RV's, just cars. This should help ease the parking situations: kids home from college break, holiday visitors, etc. just be sure to call the office in advance. Enjoy the rest of the summer, cool weather will be here soon.

## Stoneybrook House Painting

Our Stoneybrook developer, Lennar, initially painted our homes with a builder grade Sherman Williams paint having a life expectancy of just seven years. All our homes were built more than seven years ago. The majority of homeowners have recognized the need to repaint and have already done so. There remain an estimated 100 Stoneybrook homes that haven't been repainted and need it now.

A home needing repainting most likely has lost its crisp, attractive color and has paint that no longer adequately seals and protects the underlying stucco surface from Florida weather. Both of these qualities are essential to maintaining your home's value and maintaining community values. There is an objective test of your home's paint that can be performed by a Sherman Williams representative or a Sherman Williams trained Stoneybrook Property Manager staff member. This test is called a "caulk test". The test determines if the pigment and body of the paint has deteriorated to the point that it no longer protects your home's stucco surface. In severe cases of paint deterioration there are hairline cracks and small chips in the stucco that only increase in size and ultimately increase the complexity and cost of patching and painting your home.

## House painting continued...

The Stoneybrook Property Manager will be initiating a series of home paint inspections beginning in October to identify homes needing repainting. Once a home is identified, the homeowner will be notified in a letter and given a period of time to arrange repainting. An Architectural Review Committee (ARC) form will be attached to the citation letter, as this ARC form must be submitted to the Property Manager and approved prior to initiating the repainting project. The Property Manager's office will have available a paint pallet available to assist you in making your color selections. At the Property Manager's office in the recreation center and the [stoneybrookhoa.com](http://stoneybrookhoa.com) website you can obtain a suggested paint contractor specifications to help you negotiate the cost of your home's repainting project. These "specs." identify a benchmark price to negotiate to. There are local, quality paint contractors that have agreed to and met both the painting specs and benchmark price. Ask your neighbors who have had their homes repainted for contractor suggestions.
