

Dear Corkscrew Shores,

As of Tuesday, June 2, 2020 Houseguests may begin accessing and using the Amenities for Corkscrew Shores. To comply with CDC Maximum Occupancy Guidelines for COVID-19, Day Guests are not allowed at this time. Please note that your Houseguest must be properly registered via the current Association House Guest Policy.

- A Houseguest is defined as a guest residing in a Member's residence located in the Corkscrew Shores Community. All other guests shall be considered a Day Guest.
- Houseguests must be registered by the Member with Management and are required to sign the Waiver & Release Form prior to using the amenities.

The Spa will also open as of Tuesday, June 2. The Spa maximum occupancy is limited to 4 people. We ask that you continue practicing Social Distancing requirements of 6ft apart.

The above policies are subject to change should allowing Houseguests cause the Amenities to exceed the maximum occupancy limits provided by CDC Guidelines. We appreciate your understanding during these uncharted times. We look forward to seeing you and your Houseguests enjoying the Amenities and Captains Club Outside Window!
