Greens Report

The course recovered well from the snowstorm, but electrical issues with the drainage transfer pump adjacent number 13 tee have plagued us. Until resolved, WGC will make every effort to stem the "flooding" on holes 12 and 14 by using back-up pimps and/or borrowing a transportable pump from the City of Oak Harbor.

If you noticed that our greens and some of our fairways are draining better than in the past it is because we are treating them with a product that allows the water to penetrate the earth instead of staying on the surface. This product will also reduce the irrigation and sprinkling requirements during the dry season.

We also hope you noticed al of the brush cleating and tree pruning being accomplished, for example behind and to the right of number 2. This clearing not only makes the course more aesthetic and playable, but the "limbing" also facilitates better airflow and sunlight (drying) throughout the course, especially in proximity of the greens.

Please be careful with your carts, there are still some muddy areas (and will be through May) on the course. And, if you see others driving too close to greens or pulling donuts in the fairways, please kindly ask them to be careful. Thank you.
