The President(ial)'s Cup

Over the course of one year, Whidbey Golf Club members earn points based primarily on participation and to a certain degree on performance in tournaments. The points are weighted towards the Mens and Ladies Club Championship and Invitationals, followed by all other events. The actual Cup matches comprise three rounds of intense match play – Round 1) Two-Person Best Ball; Round 2) Two-Person Alternate Shot (nobody's favorite); and Round 3) Individual Match Play.

Prior to the event, the President John Geragotelis with Co-Captain Club Manager Arik Dahlen and Vice President Pat Ford with Co-Captain Head Professional Dave Phay, meet to select teams and pairings. Then the competitors, along with family and ALL former-year competitors, begin the weekend with a formal dinner. Pictured on Page 3 are the 16 members who qualified and accepted the challenge.

The teams split the Saturday morning Best Ball matches, 2 to 2. This year's Cup was essentially decided in Saturday's second round, the dreaded Alternate Shot format when the VP Team took 3.5 out of 4 points, all but guaranteeing a victory. Though the President's team fought gallantly on Sunday in the Singles matches, winning 2 matches handily and bring the 6 remaining matches down to the wire, the VP team could not be beat, ultimately winning the Cup 9 to 7.

Greens Report, From the Super

The greens are healing after a successful fall aerification. We did see quite a bit of fungus attacking some of the back nine greens, especially number 14. This is quite common after all the stress and damage caused to the plant during aerification. Michrodocium nivale (pink snow mold) likes 50 degree Fahrenheit nights and moist weather. With the cooling temperatures and rain, the conditions were perfect for the fungus to attack the grass. A fungicide application was applied and the grass is recovering. The greens are now down to the winter height of cut @ .130 inch. During the summer we cut @ .120 inch. Just the one hundredth of and inch difference helps the plant stay healthier and resist being infected by fungal pathogens that are always present in the soil.

You may have noticed the birds digging up areas around the course, especially the area left of 9 approach. This is them going for the European Crane Fly larvae. In the coming weeks I will be making an insecticide and surfactant application to the whole course. This means that each of the 9's will have to be shut down for a day. Nobody is allowed in the areas being sprayed for 24 hours after the application. The surfactant is basically a soap that helps water move through the soil profile. The particular product I will be spraying has been used for decades by potato farmers to make harvesting less muddy and has been approved to use on turfgrass for a few years now. I sprayed this last year and I feel that it really helped keep the fairways less soggy all winter.

On Oct. 20th and 21st Pacific Sportsturf will be here to deep tine the greens again. The process involves an eight inch tine that goes into the green and then "kicks" at the bottom to break up the subsoil of the green. This allows for better drainage and airflow in the green. Similar to aerification but less damage to the surface. When we punch the greens we can only affect the top four inches of the profile. This process breaks up the profile further down than our aerification machines can go.

We are able to accommodate groups again and had a busy weekend in October with both our Presidents Cup banquet and a recent wedding. Our bridge group has returned but we have not yet restarted Bunko. In lieu of that activity, consider enjoying fresh air and fall leaves while learning/practicing a bit of golf.
