



GOLF & GOLF COURSE OPERATIONS

- 1) To maintain minimum social distancing of 6 feet as required by Governor Brown's most recent executive order (20-12), walking is encouraged. Carts are allowed as long as each player takes his/her own cart. Only individuals who live together in the same household may ride together...no exceptions. Carts MUST remain on the paths or driven in the rough only, no fairway traffic other than to cross to the other side, one or the other.
- 2) Bunker rakes will be removed and golfers are asked to smooth their prints as best possible with their foot or their golf club.
- 3) Ball washers have been removed.
- 4) Flagsticks must remain in the hole. Cup liners will be maintained at one inch above ground and a ball considered "holed" when having struck the liner. If a player inadvertently pulls the flagstick, he/she is asked to wipe it clean. If a ball inadvertently comes to rest in the hole, please remove it with a gloved hand...again, do NOT pull the flagstick.

At this time, golf may not seem quite the same, but to us your health and safety is our utmost concern. We greatly appreciate your support in any way you can help. We are all in this together and therefore all must do our part...allowing us to remain open and for golf to be a viable opportunity to get out and enjoy the fresh air.
