Turf Talk- Lees Hill Agronomy

I get this question a lot- "what do you guys do in the winter?" The short answer is more than you think. It is the perfect time of the year from projects to tackle much-needed projects while the turf is now dormant and not actively growing. On our golf course the scope of this work can include irrigation repair, native area cutting, bunker repair, maintenance facility cleaning and organizing and equipment repair and preventive maintenance. Actually, it's the busiest time of the year for our equipment manager as he as he prepares all mowing equipment for the spring and handles maintenance or repair as needed to the rest of our fleet.

I myself am in the process of reviewing and interpreting the most recent soil test reports that we done last month, and designing the agronomic programs for all surfaces with greens being the number one priority. It's important to have a plan in place that reflects the right choice of products that will provide consistent and proven results. Basically, I decide what goes in the sprayer and spreaders and when. Weather conditions dictate much of this as well as other considerations including time or year, overall plant health and performance and presentation of the turf grass along with other environmental factors.

Speaking of soil test reports- I did numbers 1, 16 and the practice green a few weeks ago. The reports are complex and show levels of all 16 nutrients that the turf grass needs to grow, along with other information. This helps me make the right decisions. Some of the numbers are OK, and some are not.

The organic matter is way too high in the top 1 inch of greens. This causes many problems including the subsurface to hold more water which reduces soil oxygen which increases disease pressure. High OM will also reduces nutrient availability which reduces the soil microbes ability to break down that's and OM. Sand topdressing also helps reduce OM and thatch.

The Phosphorus is also extremely high. After aerification the P numbers should fall. When I get those numbers down, the Calcium, Magnesium, Manganese and Iron will be available to the plant.
