#### <u>Turf Talk April 2024</u>

Well, you may have heard this expression before but, 'It is going to get a lot uglier before it gets prettier. Ok now the explanation. I was on our site one week before the aerification so you will see the process of aerification again for its annual spring process.

For the aerification this Spring, March 18, an outside contractor was hired to deep-tine aerify the greens. Using a 1/2" diameter tine, that will penetrate the soil profile as deep as 7 inches, it will open up the green surface and penetrate any profile layer that may prohibit improved oxygen exchange. Following that process the maintenance team will aerify, using our own machine, to core and remove small plugs from the top 2" profile of the root zone. As you read in a previous Turf Talk, there is a high level of organic matter that needs to be modified to allow an environment for ideal turf growth. Once the organic matter is removed, the cores/plugs were replaced with a screened sand that will allow for improved soil porosity that will also aid in the degradation of this organic matter layer. Key thought, the soil is a growing and evolving solution/entity and that is why we aerify to match the growth of the grass and the soil.

In addition to the aerification, the staff is preparing a seed bed for a newer variety of bentgrass that the trials show is superior to older varieties in many ways. Most notable is that this variety is one of the more favorable varieties to interseed to an existing stand of bentgrass greens turf. Our efforts here are multifaceted by eliminating the poa and all the seed heads associated with this type of grass and introducing an improved variety of bentgrass plant.

Ok, so you ask, what are you doing next? Well there are quite a few areas that need attention. I want to focus on getting the greens back into the superior condition, if not better, than they were before so obvious they are receiving our top focus. If I was to compare the course conditions to a dart board, the greens are the bulls eye.

As bad as the bunkers are I feel at best, a band-aid approach is really all we can do until a complete rebuild can take place. So, the most likely approach for immediate action is to attempt to remove as much rock as possible and add sand to make them more playable and presentable. A complete rebuild would include digging out the existing floor of the bunker, replacing all the drainage, installing a barrier to prevent the heaving

of the sub-profile of native rock from getting into the bunker sand. Regardless, the bunkers will be no quick fix. Other areas of the course that stick out to me are the bare ground areas at the tees and green approaches which can be improved with sod and seed and controlling cart traffic. Other areas of work will include winter and summer annual weed control. There are several more areas that I haven't mentioned, but I would like to hear from you. Tell me what you think! Ok so you are probably thinking to yourselves, why didn't he mention the irrigation system? Well, for what it matters; it will fall under the band-aid category for the time being.

I would like to mention at this time that I am grateful to Jamie and the staff and all the members and volunteers who have shown their support for me and welcoming me to Lee's Hill Golf Club. I would also like to give thanks to Richard and the maintenance staff for the hard work they've done and continue to do to keep things moving forward. And last but not least, thank you Christian Cooper, the new Assistant Superintendent, for all your hard work for this month's aerification process.
