

<u>90 Degree Cart Rule: Important (please read)</u> At this time of the year, it is **extremely important** to

enter the fairways at 90 degrees to the ball from the path in order to help not wear out the turf at the beginning of each fairway once leaving the tee box. We are noticing an abundance of wear in these areas and we want to avoid putting up ropes/signs in order to keep carts from damaging the turf further. Your help and attention to this matter is most appreciated

TURF TALK

Still waiting for an increase in temperatures as this has been the coolest beginning to Spring that I can remember. No matter what we do to the turf, we just can't make it grow without some sunshine and warmth.

Greens are healing slowly after aeration but should be in good shape for May. Applications of growth regulators the past two months to reduce seedhead production have also increased their healing time and since temperatures are still not high enough to stop seedhead production, they are beginning to appear. I have decided not to apply them anymore to allow them to heal and not cause anymore yellowing. Unfortunately we will have to deal with the seedheads, until temperatures reach the 80's for about a week. We will soon verticut and topdress lightly to help with the bumpiness that they create. Pre-emergent herbicide was sprayed the first part of the month to the entire course. Round-up herbicide was included in the rough to kill any weeds. The Bermuda is still very dormant and we are anxiously waiting for it to green-up. I am always a little nervous about winter kill this time of the year, especially following the cold and wet Winter that we just experienced. Tees were just fertilized to help push its progress, and fairways will soon be fed as well.

Granular fertilizer has been applied to greens twice, in small doses, and as soil temperatures rise, more nutrients will be released. We will now start foliar feeding them every 10 to 14 days and begin our plant protection programs with insecticides and fungicides. In the coming month we will also busy repairing irrigation, completing our mulching, and chipping debris left by a storm a few weeks ago. With some good weather we will finally be out mowing some grass and the long wait will be over.
