Proper attire is required at all times while on property. While on the golf course, "soft spikes" or non metal spikes must be worn at all times. All shirts must have a collar. Neither jeans nor denim pants are allowed at any time. Your cooperation and support is appreciated.

TURF TALK

The golf course improved quite a bit during May once temperatures finally reached the eighties, and we received some much needed rainfall. The Bermudagrass throughout the course continues to recover from a damaging winter season that caused thinning and some winter kill. Fairways are in pretty good shape with only a few areas left to fill in completely. We will be aerating fairways in June to relieve compaction, allow water and air to penetrate the surface, and improve overall health. Most of the tees are also in good condition but several still need some work. The weaker tees will be aerated again, topdressed with sand and fertilized weekly. We hope to level and sod the gold tee on #7 and the white tee on #17 early in the month.

The rough is the weakest portion of the golf course. The green surrounds in particular contain areas that died out completely during the winter. Last season we installed sod that was not mature enough to survive the cold, so we will once again sod many of those spots. All the rough will soon be fertilized again and should continue to improve. Please help allow the turf to progress by avoiding worn areas with golf carts and driving ninety degrees from the cart paths to your golf ball.

The greens of course are the most important portion of the course, and they receive the most attention and care. Three applications of growth regulators were applied this spring to suppress the production of seedheads from poa annua turf. This regulation caused some yellowing which went away once the chemical left the plant.

Unfortunately it had not warmed enough at that time so seedheads did emerge. Mostly, they have not affected ball roll until late in the afternoon and they should soon fade away as temperatures get too high for the plant to sustain them. The greens remain our highest priority and we will do our best to keep them in good shape through the difficult summer environment.
