Turf Talk – June 2024

Come on June! Let's get the day time temps consistently up to 85 degrees and the night time temps above 65.

With some some assistance from the irrigation system and a little rain from Mother Nature, let's get these fairways jumping. We have been trying to establish the fairway to roughline edges and I feel we are closing in on it! As of this writing we are using marking paint to outline the fairway and approach areas creating different looks and even shot-making chances.

On both 3 and 4, the green complexes have been widened. On number 4 the shorter cut to the right of the green has cleaned up the bailout area for those that like to putt the ball from off the green.



Our current labor shortage is being addressed as we have added several new people. This is helping us address the playability of our bunkers, spray side areas to clean up and contain overgrown areas of poison ivy and blackberry shrubs and of course continue to make progress with conditions of the irrigation system. As the maintenance staff continues to work making Lee's Hill a fun and challenging golf course, we have been able to accomplish more and more. We are striving to establish and maintain better playing conditions even though we've battled with the changing of the seasons. We are doing things agronomically as well aesthetically. We have stepped up the care of the greens through consistent applications of foliar fertilizing, applications of turf care products to be better able to withstand disease and insect infestation, and slowly we are improving the playability of the greens surface by growing a healthier stand of grass. But of course, there is still more that needs to be done. For instance, establishing and maintaining a topdressing program with a clean, screened sand that assist in the natural decomposition of the heavy organics in the top 2" layer of the greens but also assists in providing a smoother rolling putt by filling voids in the turf.

As previously mentioned, we are also doing things to improve the aesthetics. Call it a fresh coat of paint if you will. We have installed news cups, new flagsticks and new flags. We will install new 150yd posts, edge and paint the yardage blocks of the 200,150 and 100 yard markers, address the ballwashers inability to properly clean golfballs even if it means replacement.

I know I could go on and on because there is a long list but for now I will see you on the course and stay tuned.
