TURF TALK

The hot, humid, and wet conditions through June, has the golf course green and lush. The bermudagrass loves this weather and we are joking that you can hear the grass growing. It has been difficult keeping up with the rough, which is a problem we rarely experience due to the poor soils in these areas. Fairways have recovered nicely from a difficult winter and the tees have filled in as well. The rough around greens experienced the most winter kill due to traffic and mechanical wear, but have also improved very much. We will soon be sodding the larger spots that we do not believe will fill in on their own.

Unlike the bermudagrass, our poa annua greens have not liked the weather this past month. They have remained in good shape but have required constant care. Saturated soils followed by high heat and humidity do not allow the plant the oxygen it needs to survive. Roots can begin to shrink and rot, as it is the perfect environment to produce damaging diseases. On the 15th we observed Anthracnose on the greens and immediately went in to "survival mode." The height of cut was raised slightly and our grooved rollers were switched to smooth ones, to relieve some of the stress the plant was experiencing. In the next eight days we spiked twice to help dry the top layer and did a personal record of six spray applications. These included fungicides to kill disease, fertilizers for recovery, and wetting agents to push the moisture through the soil. We also sprayed a stabilized oxygen product and Turfscreen which helps protect the plant and fight algae. The most affected greens were also aerated with small solid tines.

In addition to this work, we repaired six irrigation leaks, edged bunkers, and topdressed tee divots, along with all of our normal maintenance tasks. Yes it was a very busy but productive month. I expect July to be challenging also but you never know what "Mother Nature" will bring. We will continue to try to improve the course for you to enjoy. Please help us out by repairing ball marks properly. The soft conditions cause impressions from even short approach shots.
