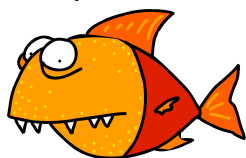

TURF TALK

As June arrived so did our typical Summer weather. The abundance of rainfall that we received in May disappeared and we have become very dry. Several storms have just missed us but we are hopeful to get some relief soon.

Greens are hanging in there pretty well despite the hot and dry weather. We have been feeding them lightly every ten days or so, applying fungicides on a fourteen day schedule, and spraying wetting agents to help keep moisture evenly in the root zone. Hand watering is almost a daily practice to provide enough water in dry spots without getting excessive moisture in other areas.

Fairways and rough are much more of a challenge for us to keep wet. Despite running over 1.5 million gallons of water through the first three weeks of June, they are hard and dry. Our soils are very rocky and tend to compact from cart traffic, not allowing water to penetrate well. We are currently aerating fairways to help out and soon will be applying gypsum to also aid in this issue. A few good rains would be the best remedy and improve conditions dramatically. Please avoid worn and drier spots when driving carts. Traveling 90 degrees from the cart path to your ball, after your tee shot, is important to disperse traffic and not wear out a path to fairways.

July is always a challenge for the maintenance team, but we will do our best to provide the best conditions as possible. Please help out by repairing a few ball marks on each green. It only takes a few seconds and can help out tremendously.

90 Degree Cart Rule: Important (please read)

At this time of the year, it is extremely important to enter the fairways at 90 degrees to the ball from the path in order to help not wear out the turf at the beginning of each fairway once leaving the tee box. Your help and attention to this matter is most appreciated.
