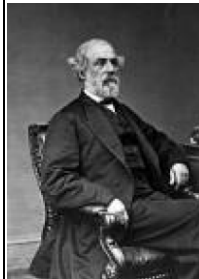

TURF TALK

“When it rains, it pours.” With a week remaining in June we have received close to twelve inches of rain on the golf course. This has been good for our bermudagrass, on tees and fairways, but is very detrimental to poa annua greens. The complete saturation of the soil profile on greens causes many problems. Soft conditions mean many ball marks, footprinting, and bumpy surfaces. Roots shrivel up and with no air exchange can rot or fall victim to disease. We have been attempting to combat this problem by solid tine aerifying and spiking frequently, but while helping at the surface, this does not alleviate the lack of air at a greater depth. We also applied fungicides to fight disease and slightly raised height of cut to give the turf a chance to recover.

The maintenance crew, in between rainstorms, has been kept busy just trying to keep up with our mowing and course clean-up. It has been difficult to get to some of the more detail tasks that we normally accomplish. We are in the process of looking for more employees and hope to bring some on board soon. Many areas that experienced winter-kill have improved and are filling in.

We still hope to sod some of the larger spots this season, but the lack of labor and bad weather has prevented us from doing so thus far. Bunkers have washed out five times in the last three weeks and it is very time consuming and difficult work when they are repaired. July looks to get hotter so our challenges will continue.

We will do our best to keep greens alive and the course playable. Please help out by repairing several ball marks on every green and by avoiding damaged or wet areas with golf carts.

90 Degree Cart Rule: Important (please read)

At this time of the year, it is extremely important to enter the fairways at 90 degrees to the ball from the path in order to help not wear out the turf at the beginning of each fairway once leaving the tee box. Your help and attention to this matter is most appreciated.
