Did you know that ice cream is one of the oldest desserts in the world? Today, purveyors of Ben & Jerry's ice cream say vanilla is the favorite flavor in the United States, as well as in Germany, Italy, and Brazil. #### **Turf Talk**



It feels as though there is so much to talk about. **Fairy ring**, cart traffic, progress and more, like cooking my latest version of Shepard's Pie. I just want to say I feel like we

are making progress, we are moving forward. I realize the distance we must travel but day by day we are moving forward. Fairy Ring, WTH? Yes, my friends there is such a thing! So, I could give you a long narrative of this condition but I will spare you so I will just give you the basics.

Continued..... There are different types of Fairy Ring but as you may have noticed, Type 1 is the most damaging to turf. It produces conditions in the soil that become hydrophobic or are unable to accept water as it continues to grow through the soil. In the process, ammonium nitrogen is released into the soil to the point of toxic levels. It is further encouraged by drought, inadequate irrigation, and aerification.

Recently, we did a small, needle-tine aerification, the second of its kind this year. The objective was to open the greens to receive a timely application of a combination of fungicides to be watered into the soil profile where the microbes produce the harmful effects. Seasonal treatments are required to treat but there are preventative measures to follow starting earlier in the year.

Cart traffic seems to become more and more a concern. Currently, as of this writing, we are under caution by restricting cart usage to rough only on the cart path side. Honestly, my first thought was to restrict carts to the path but I have compromised, and only request you stay in the rough on the cart path side of the fairway until we receive adequate rainfall to sustain a healthy growth pattern for our fairways.

I do plan on initiating a cart traffic maintenance program in the first week of July. Directional posts will be installed to provide guidance for cart usage to follow. Posts will be installed to illustrate where to enter and where to exit the fairways. White posts with green tips will show where carts may enter the fairways. White posts with red tips will show where carts need to return to the path. The effort here is not only to direct cart traffic but also to encourage turf growth at our tees and greens where previously our bermudagrass has not been allowed to flourish. We all know that bermudagrass can grow on asphalt but with traffic and poor soil conditions, we got bare spots!

Since the beginning of my time here at Lee's Hill, I've stated that anything we do with the irrigation and bunkers would be nothing more than a band-aid. The staff has worked diligently on the irrigation system, and we are making progress by hiring the right personnel for the situation. Thank goodness we are correcting issues but by no means are we solving the problems. Regarding the bunkers, hopefully you are experiencing improvements to the playability of our bunkers. We are busy edging, redistributing sand and in general, cleaning up the mess. Contrarily though, the more we work to get the bunkers back into play, the more rock 'pebbles' I see on the green surface. This is damaging to your club equipment. Rebuilding is becoming more of a necessity each day.

Ok, so I've shared my thoughts on the course while making the best Shepard's Pie ever! Now for some Carrot cake! Stay tuned and see you on the golf course.
