Turf Talk – July 2025

Are you ready? I ask again, are you ready?

Regardless of the season, they all run together, day to day, month to month, year to year, and they influence a response. We all want the best and most prime conditions, especially when now is the season for national championships and the four majors. But let's be real. Can we ever be a host for a championship, regardless of the level; local, regional, state or national, am I dreaming? Can we provide the best conditions possible for our members and guests?

The weaknesses of this course have been the same since I began my efforts here: Irrigation and Bunkers. What is the answer? Let's just say, occupying our efforts on those two, take away efforts on other areas that need attention. Besides juggling labor, I equate it to my experience in construction and issues of 're-work'. Theory: Re-work costs three times the work. First is to do the job; second is to fix the issues of poor repair from effort of people who are not qualified, let alone, know what they are doing, and then the cost of what you could be doing to better improve conditions of the job at hand.

I am currently developing areas on the course to reduce maintenance, and this will take time and the use of herbicides to keep these areas clean and free of weeds. In conjunction with the development of these areas, I hope to reduce the use of irrigation. Other areas that I strive to eliminate are issues from cart traffic. We don't have the best of soil conditions and development of healthy turf remains out of control. We must apply amendments to the soil and simple adherence to cart traffic. We must make a start. Areas that need as much attention are the areas affected by inadequate Tee space, especially the par-three tees and tees that are affected by the neglect of tree management. Too many areas are overgrown and have limited playability of shot-making, but the shade is prohibiting conditions for bermudagrass growth, existence and health. I can see where previous managers have introduced Zoysiagrass to combat the shade issue, but the issue remains.

Now we are talking about equipment needs. The discussion really involves not only Capital Expense, but also Capital Improvements. And there we are, are you ready?
