#### TURF TALK

Like every other July, heat and humidity created challenges in maintaining the golf course; however we did receive a good amount of rainfall. It has been perfect weather for the burmuda grass. Fairways, tees and rough are probably in the best condition that we have seen for this time of year. Much of our time is being spent just trying to keep the turf mowed and playable. We also have to blow clippings in the afternoons due to the rapid growth. Heavy rains in May and June have lessened the efficacy of our preemergent applications of herbicides. Most fairways are pretty clean, but I am now starting to see some breakthrough of crabgrass and goosegrass. Sedge weeds are also present but less of a problem and not as noticeable as long as the grass is mowed. I will be able to eradicate the sedge as soon as temperatures are low enough that the herbicides will not harm the Bermuda grass. Weeds in the rough are more numerous because we are only able to apply pre emergence once to that much acreage, these applications are very expensive. I expect in August to have some goosegrass appear in greens but we should be able to control it by manually removing it as it becomes evident.

In the last few days of June we received a huge unexpected storm, producing around two inches of rain. Unfortunately I had just sprayed a wetting agent on the greens that helps hold water in the rootzone. The combination caused the roots to suffer and we experienced some damage from anthracnose, a disease that caused yellowing and thinning in the poa anna turf. After a couple of fungicide applications, spiking, topdressing and light weekly doses of fertilizer, the greens have improved very much. I have been pleasantly surprised at how they have responded despite the high temperatures. A few bare areas remain but continue to fill in, and we avoid these spots as best we can with our pin placements. I have been two completely opposite weather predictions for the month of August. One shows the continuation of heat and humidity, the other a nice trough of cooler air. Naturally I am hoping for the latter to help us get through the summer and make your playing experience nicer. If we can get to greens aeration in the condition we are in now, or better, the course will be at its best ever this autumn. Thanks.
