This year for Member Guest we welcome our Members to bring another member as their guest.

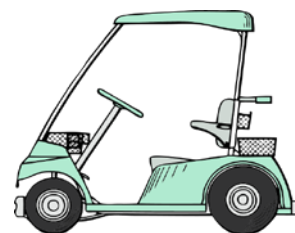

Turf Talk



Turf Talk July 21, 2022

The summer season rolls on as we move into August. Hard to believe our summer help will be returning to school in the next few weeks.

You've probably noticed our bunker grassing project on the course. We have installed a total of 5,000 square feet of Zoysia sod in the following bunkers, 8 green, 8 fairway, left side, 12 green, 14 green, 17 green and 18 green. We intend to push mow these at a height of 3 in. This will provide players a challenge without being overly penal. The course has been holding up well thus far.

We will continue to cool greens off as needed through the remainder of the hot weather. This ensures that the turf remains cooled off and hydrated thus preventing any wilt. Excessively dry areas on greens generally desiccate and have the tendency to thin out in most cases. The key is to moderate the temperature in the canopy area of the turf to prevent overheating.

Stay cool and we look forward to seeing you on the course!

90 Degree Cart Rule: Important (please read)

At this time of the year, it is extremely important to enter the fairways at 90 degrees to the ball from the path in order to help not wear out the turf at the beginning of each fairway once leaving the tee box. Your help and attention to this matter is most appreciated.
