Turf Talk August 25

Ahhh! The Dog Days of summer are here. Do you know the only good things about the Dog Days? Well, the most important thing is that we are alive to experience them. And the second thing is that they are here and that we are that much closer to them being over. Let's hope that they will go easy on us; No major rain events, no serious drought and that the course continues to prosper from rains received. Is that asking too much?

We have been very fortunate with the weather when compared to other courses in the area. Some, both east and west of us, have received much more rain than us. In June we recorded just over 7 inches of rain and to date in July, we have received 6.72 inches of rain with almost two weeks left in the month. To put things in perspective, the average rainfall for our location in the month of June is 4.37. And in July, the average amount is similar at 4.38 inches. Of course, other ingredients to this 'soup' are Relative Humidity and Dew Points, which as you would expect, have also been at higher levels. On June 26, we recorded the temperature at 4:50 in the afternoon as 109 degrees and the heat index at 136 degrees.

So, what does this all mean? The two biggest by-products of these occurrences are 1) our fungicide and wetting agent budgets have been off the charts. There are different kinds of wetting agents on the market for golf courses. We have been using a special type that allows for excess moisture to move through the soil profile but leave enough for the top layer of the profile to have adequate amounts to sustain a proper growing environment. Now, onto 2). And the music has become more dramatic! I think I have mentioned in previous turf talks that there is a concern for both our green drainage and our bunker drainage. As you play your round you may see these areas where there are green exits for the internal drainage that have been lost or the roots of our overgrown tree lines have found them and are currently preventing the release of excess moisture or any moisture to exit in an appropriate amount of time. As a result, no matter the amount of fungicide or wetting agent applications can prevent thinning of the turf in these areas. Greens on 7 and 15 are the most notable but clearly not the only ones. As our Irrigation has no As-built plan, neither does our Drainage. The bunkers are also in the same situation but any random digging to locate would be more centralized to the bunker So where does that leave us? Yep! You guessed it! Lots and lots of more digging with old equipment and/or the basic pick and shovel. Good times!

Enjoy your golf; please repair your ball marks, sand your divots and we'll see you on the course.
