TURF TALK

The past few years August brought cooler temperatures and good rains to recover from dry and hot Summers. This year has been the opposite as we are now experiencing dry conditions, receiving only about an inch of rain through the month. During August we applied twice the amount of water that was used in June and July combined. Cooler night-time temperatures and shorter days are helping, but the drier, less humid air causes the need for more irrigation. As our water supply pond is getting low, the quality of the water is also decreasing. I'm trying to avoid renting a pump to transfer water from #12 pond, due to the expense, but if we do not receive a good rain soon it will be necessary.

The maintenance team worked hard to prepare the course for the Club Championship last month, and judging from many player comments the event went very well. We completed many projects prior to the tournament to improve playing conditions. During the last two weeks of August we installed sod to several areas of the course and completed aeration of the greens. The sod was not in good condition when it was delivered and I had my doubts that it would survive. Fortunately it did bounce back and should be good once we aerate, roll, and topdress it to level it out. Greens aeration went well at the end of the month and we expect them to heal quickly. A nice rainfall would certainly help them recover faster.

September is an important month for managing turfgrass. The warm season grass needs to be prepared for dormancy and a long winter without growing. A fertilizer application containing primarily potassium will be applied to strengthen the plant and keep it green a little longer. Cool season grasses need to be seeded and fertilized as well. We will seed collars and the Driving Range tees soon with Perennial Ryegrass. Fairways and tees will get a pre-emergent weed application to prevent poa-annua and broadleaf weeds through the fall and winter seasons.

As always, I ask that you repair ball marks properly. Greens are extremely soft following aeration and require gentle repair to encourage healing. Please drive 90 degrees to your ball after your tee shots to avoid wearing out areas of turf.
