TURF TALK

As we enter November, the leaves are beginning to fall and the grass growing season is coming to an end. Overall the course is in good shape but as always we want it to be better. A dry Autumn was not good for seed germination on greens and collars, slowing recovery on the few greens that do not have 100 percent coverage. Turf is spreading into these areas however and hopefully will be completely filled in before Winter.

Due to the slow growth of all our grass this time of year it is even more important that ball marks on greens are repaired properly and that golf carts not be driven over the same areas repeatedly. Please help out by fixing several marks when on the greens and by avoiding worn bermudagrass with your carts.

The maintenance staff will be busy blowing leaves throughout November to keep the course as clean as possible. Please understand that on windy and wet days there may be little that we can do. Bunkers and sprinkler heads will be edged for the final time this year and we will be repairing irrigation leaks. If we receive some rain and temperatures remain moderate we hope to seed the target greens on the driving range and the collars for a second time. Brush cutting and tree removal is also planned throughout the Winter.

Currently I am reviewing what went right and what we can improve upon from this past season, as I am preparing a maintenance schedule for next year. Every year is different and challenging due to the weather, and changes are always made as needed, but it is good to have this guideline to be prepared. There are several projects and improvements that we are discussing, and hope to fit within our budget. A new equipment lease will begin in 2018 which will provide us with an even better and more dependable fleet, vital to the care of the golf course.
