TURF TALK

Fall has arrived but favorable growing weather should continue for the next several weeks. Bare and thin areas on greens have been seeded,topdressed and fertiized several times in order to facilitate recovery. This will continue into fall as these areas fill in.

Greens are receiving weekly fertilizations, alternating between granular and foliar applications to ensure optimal plant development as we near the end of our growing season. The remainder of the course will also be fertilized prior to winter with a potassium based product that will help the bermudagrass to better withstand persistently cold temperatures.Rough areas with cool season turf will be spot seeded as necessary.

Collars will be seeded following our Club Championship to promote an improved playing surface and green complex uniformity for winter play. Weed spraying and mechanical removal continues as we are cleaning up any remaining grassy weed species.Irrigation head trimming is nearly complete.

In addition all yardage markers have been trimmed and fairway markers repainted. We anticipate a later than normal fall leaf drop this year due to our excessively wet weather in 2018. However we will be ready for the onslaught with two heavy duty blowers to keep them out of play areas. Looking forward to seeing you on the course throughout the fall!
